Twenty-Ninth Sunday in Ordinary Time, October 16, 2011

Dear Parishioners,

In September, each parish of our diocese received a letter from Bishop Thomas John Paprocki declaring October 16th to be celebrated as a Day of Thanksgiving in honor of Blessed Pope John Paul II. There are special prayers and readings to be used for that day. This Mass is to be celebrated both on the evening of October 15, 2011 at the anticipated Mass and throughout the day of October 16, 2011. Because this decree involves all of us in the diocese, and because it is a rare occurrence to change the liturgical rule of Sundays, I thought that I would publish it for your reading purposes:

Whereas, following the death of the great Pope John Paul II, the faithful fervently asked His Holiness Pope Benedict XVI to raise his predecessor to the dignity of the altars, and

Whereas, when, after the appropriate investigations into his life and holiness were complete, the Holy See set the date for the beatification of Blessed John Paul II and received numerous requests from the faithful requesting permission to celebrate the memorial of Blessed Pope John Paul II in locations outside of Vatican City State and Poland, where his memorial has been placed on the local calendars of liturgical celebrations, and

Whereas, the Congregation for Divine Worship and the Discipline of the Sacraments, in the Decree on the Liturgical Observance of the Cult of Blessed John Paul, Pope of April 2, 2011, has granted to Diocesan Bishops permission to allow the celebration of the Holy Mass of Thanksgiving to God for the gift of Blessed John Paul II on the days and in the places of his choosing within the time of a year following his beatification, and

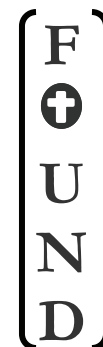
Whereas the College of Cardinals gathered in Conclave elected then Karol Cardinal Wojtyla to the See of St. Peter on October 16, 1978,

Therefore I, Most Reverend Thomas John Paprocki, by the grace of God and the Apostolic See Bishop of Springfield in Illinois, hereby decree Sunday, October 16, 2011 to be observed as a Day of Thanksgiving to God in all of the parishes, churches, shrines and chapels within the Diocese of Springfield in Illinois for the life, teaching, and ministry of Blessed Pope John Paul II and that Masses be celebrated in honor of Blessed Pope John Paul II.

Given at Springfield, Illinois, this 22nd day of the month of August in the Year of Our Lord, 2011, the Memorial of the Queenship of Mary.

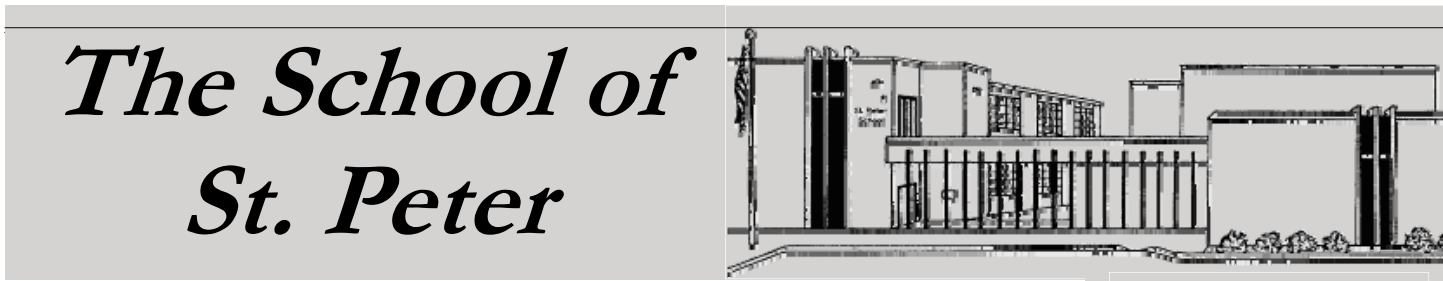
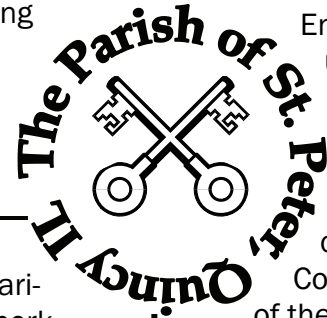
QND BAND ANNUAL FRUIT SALE

The evening session will meet from 6 to 7:30 p.m. on four consecutive Wednesdays in the Rectory Prayer Room beginning on October 26.

Parish Nurse Marty Venvertloh will be facilitator.

Through the program, grieving persons will be helped to look at the dimensions of loss and its impact on life from the Catholic point of view. Each session will include prayer, a video, and discussion.
