Dear Parishioners,

As we begin the month of November and the end of the liturgical year, the Church will begin to emphasize the end of time. This is not the easiest meditation for us, reflecting upon death and dying. But it is reality for us as human beings. And so we are called to look at our lives and ask ourselves whether we are truly prepared for the coming of the Lord in our lives. The month of November is also the time that we celebrate that article of our faith that we call the “Communion of Saints.” When I was young, I learned that the Communion of Saints were made up of the Church triumphant (those saints in heaven), the Church suffering (those souls purging themselves in preparation for heaven), and the Church Militant (those saints who are still living and struggling here on earth). This article of faith, the Communion of Saints, defines who we are as well as our ultimate goal in life. Each of us by virtue of our baptisms, has been graced by God and thus are called to live as saints. Some of those who have died have arrived at their goal and we celebrate their special day on November 1st, All Saints Day. Other saints are purging themselves even after death of human flaws, weaknesses, and decision, all in preparation for the joys of heaven. Their special day is All Souls Day, November 2nd. And we, the saints on earth who continue to struggle with life, learn from the saints in heaven, as they pray for us. We also have a responsibility to pray for those in purgatory who need our prayers and our sacrifices which assist them. The Communion of Saints is truly a unity of persons, both living and dead, who help each other until we all meet again in heaven.

Next Tuesday, November 1st, is the Solemnity of All Saints and is a Holyday of Obligation for all Catholics. Our Mass schedule will be as follows:

- Monday, October 31st: Mass will be at **6:00 p.m.** (Vigil)
- Tuesday, November 1st: Masses will be at **8:30 p.m.** (notice the time change as this Mass will be with the grade school students), **12:10 p.m.** and **6:00 p.m.**

Next Wednesday, November 2nd, is the Feast of All Souls. We will have an 8:00 a.m. Mass along with a 6:00 p.m. Mass of Remembrance. All those who have died during this past year, along with other deceased relatives, will be remembered at this Mass. The book of the dead will be placed on the St. Joseph altar for all those who would like to write the names of loved ones to be remembered at our Masses during the month of November.

As we celebrate this month of November when often our thoughts are on those who have died, we also acknowledge a responsibility to take care of the places for the dead, namely, our cemeteries. Although our cemeteries have perpetual care, the monies set aside are not enough to provide for necessary improvements for our cemeteries. And so, there are Calvary Cemetery envelopes provided for any parishioner who would like to help us continue to improve our cemeteries. Each pew has an envelope that you can return any time this week at any of our Masses.

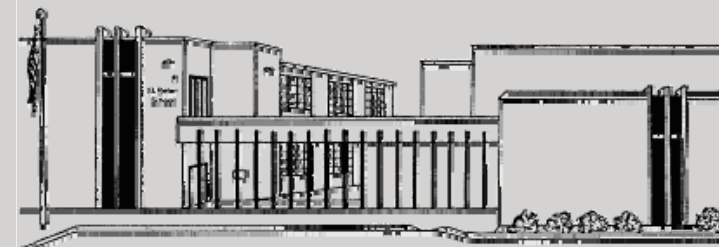
