**Dear Parishioners,**

“Amen, amen, I say to you, unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink His blood, you do not have life within you. Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood has eternal life, and I will raise that person up on the last day. For my flesh is true food and my blood is true drink. Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood remains in me and I in that person.” Whenever I read these words of Christ, I am more and more thankful for the gift of the Eucharist, for it is this sacrament that makes these words a reality for all of us. The Eucharist identifies us as Catholics; the Eucharist unites us to our God and to each other; the Eucharist is the source of all of our lives. To be Catholic means to be a Eucharistic people. These words of Christ found in our gospel for this Mass celebrating the REAL PRESENCE of Christ in the Eucharist are words that are to be taken seriously by all of us. We do not take these words seriously when we are not present at the Eucharist; we do not believe these words of Christ when we attend other Churches that are not Catholic. So as we celebrate this Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, let each of us realize that this Eucharist puts us into touch with the divine life, wholly and truly present on our altars each time that we celebrate this Sacrament. For a Catholic not to take these words seriously belies the very basic of the Catholic faith in which we live, believe and celebrate.

When my mom and dad were still living, we always went to the northern woods of Wisconsin for family vacation sometime during the first weeks of July. In fact, we had been going there for over 45 years. The entire family would gather as we rented cabins, endured the mosquitoes, and tolerated the deer flies. What was important was just being there all together as family. Needless to say, we have many memories that are cherished. But this year will be a little different. My nephew (my brother’s son) is getting married at this same time in Lancaster, Pennsylvania. So the family will be gathering that weekend for the wedding. And so, this is to let you know that I will be leaving this Wednesday, June 29th, and will be returning sometime on the weekend of July 9-10th. Once again, Fr. Bauer has graciously agreed to cover for me. To assist him on the weekend of July 2-3rd, we will be having a Maryknoll priest who will be speaking at all of our Masses concerning the mission work of his missionary order. His name is Fr. John Lange. His presence among us is in conjunction with the Missionary Co-Op plan of the diocese. 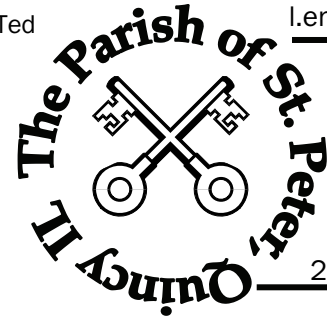
