Fourteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time, July 3, 2011

Dear Parishioners,

After celebrating two Solemnities on consecutive Sundays following Pentecost, the Church now returns to what is called "Ordinary Time." In fact, this weekend celebrates the 14th Sunday in Ordinary Time.

As we have announced previously, we are in the process of planning and coordinating our parish picnic. The date is set, Saturday, August 27th. On that particular day, our regularly scheduled 5:30 p.m. Mass will be change to 4:00 p.m., allowing for fun, food, and games to begin around 5:00 p.m. The picnic will last until 11:00 p.m. and hopefully will have the support of all of you. This weekend, we ask you to pick up an envelope with your name on it. These envelopes contain a letter explaining how you can contribute to making the picnic a success as well as some raffle tickets. 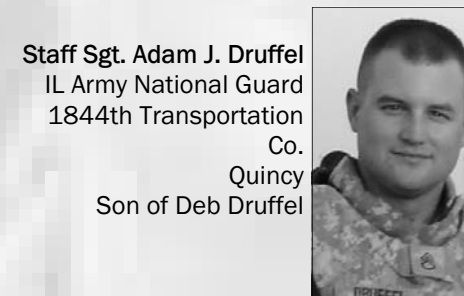
