**Dear Parishioners,**

“I am the living bread that came down from heaven; whoever eats this bread will live forever; and the bread that I will give is my flesh for the life of the world.” These are the words spoken by Jesus as we begin this gospel reading for this weekend. It always amazes me that many of our brothers and sisters in differing denominations are more than willing to literally interpret the Scriptures when trying to prove Catholicism wrong but this particular Scripture they will not interpret literally because it just doesn't fit their narrative. Instead they either ignore the Scriptures or somehow say that Jesus meant something different, betraying their literal interpretation of the Scriptures. What this particular Scripture does do, in a literal sense, is to validate the Catholic understanding of the Sacrament of the Eucharist. We firmly believe in our Sacramental theology that the Eucharist we receive each and every Sunday is the Body and Blood of Christ, the living bread that provides for us the presence of Jesus Christ, a presence that feeds and nourishes us toward eternal life. “Whoever eats this bread will live forever.” What these words elicit from me is an amazing WOW!

This weekend, the Church celebrates what was originally termed “Corpus Christi,” Latin words which mean the “Body of Christ.” This Solemnity has been changed to include not only the Body of Christ, but also the Blood of Christ, thus celebrating the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ. This celebration proclaims what St. Paul was trying to tell the Corinthians in our second reading for our Mass when he states: “the cup of blessing that we bless, is it not a participation in the Blood of Christ? The bread that we break, is it not a participation in the Body of Christ?” The answer to the question by Paul is obviously a “yes.” When we gather as Catholics each Sunday, we truly do participate in the saving mysteries of our faith, in the death and resurrection of Jesus. Each time that we gather we celebrate His sacrifice offered for us, His sacrifice that saved us. And this sacrifice was acceptable to the Father, and in turn, the we receive the greatest miracle of our faith, the Real Presence of Jesus on the altar. As Catholics, when we say the “Real Presence” we are repeating the words of Jesus who tells us that “whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood has eternal life. For my flesh is true food, and my blood is true drink. Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood remains in me and I in him.” As you can see in the words of Jesus, the bread and wine that we partake is the very Real Presence of Jesus, not some symbol. It is a miracle of faith how this happens but we firmly believe that it happens each time that we celebrate our Eucharist. So today, as we think about this miracle that happens, I hope that each of you experience as I do that amazing WOW!

How appropriate today is the refrain that we sing in the Eucharistic song that goes “O Sacrament most Holy, O Sacrament divine, All praise and all thanksgiving be every moment thine.” This is our gift of the Eucharist. To the extent that we are united with Jesus in the Eucharist, to that extent we remain in Him and He in us.”

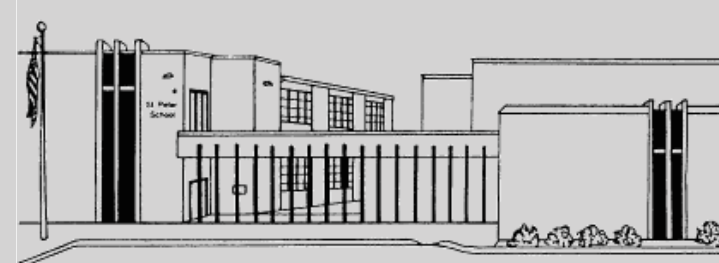
