Dear Parishioners,

Recently, the Tracy Foundation of Mt. Sterling sponsored a pastor's workshop for all priests who were pastors with schools. This is the first of five that will be taking place throughout the year. Personally, this workshop was very rewarding for me and an inspiration for my role as a pastor with a school. Believe it or not, there are no special educational classes given in the seminary to help us be a pastor with a school. This is more or less on the job training which often makes so many of us feel inadequate. And so a workshop of this caliber can only inspire, challenge, and support our efforts. I personally want to thank the Tracy Foundation for making these workshops possible for us. The leaders of this workshop were members of the faculty of Loyola University, Chicago and the Andrew Greely Center for Catholic Education. As I said, it was informative, challenging, and very inspiring and I came back to Quincy filled with a zeal to grow and develop St. Peter Catholic School here in Quincy, Illinois.

The reason for this long introduction was to set the stage for this week as we celebrate National Catholic School's Week here in the United States. We have been blessed with a rich heritage of Catholic education here in Quincy, many of us being the recipients of this rich tradition. Furthermore, since our Catholic schools still are part of the mission of our Church, it is now our role to make sure these school continue to be the same rich heritage for the next generations of Catholics. Translated, this means that we have a responsibility to support and generously contribute so that our Catholic schools not only survive for the future but are continually growing to meet the needs of our students, parish, and community.

In one of the handouts given to us in our workshop, I want to quote the following: "Catholic schools in collaboration with parents and guardians as the primary educators, seek to educate the whole child by providing an excellent education rooted in Gospel values. Since the founding of the first Catholic school, the United States Catholic Bishops speaking in conference have supported Catholic schools as a foundation to the mission of the Church. In the document "To Teach as Jesus Did," the Catholic Bishops continuously underscore the three fold mission of our Catholic schools—to proclaim the Gospel, to build community, and to serve our brothers and sisters." It is in this spirit that we celebrate our identity this week as a Catholic school. I ask your continual prayers and support as we celebrate our rich past, exciting present, and a challenging future.

During this weekend, our teachers and students will be taking part in our liturgies. I also ask the you join our students and staff at their annual pancake and sausage breakfast to be held in St. Peter gym from 8:30 to 12:30 p.m. As is our custom, we will have Chris Cakes as the people who will be preparing the food, sometimes tossing the food on our plates, and just making our day a time of enjoyment and fun. So please join us in this annual "fun" time together.

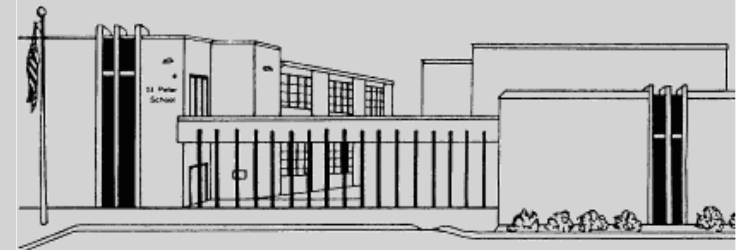
**College Scholarships for Catholic Senior Girls**

We then had the fountains in the narthex tested along with our Junior High (Seton Hall) and both of these areas were below the levels. So that is good news as it seems to reflect that the older fixtures or water sources, according to our water management plan, need to be replaced with newer fixtures. Once we do that, we will then retest the levels and hopefully resolve this issue. We are doing everything in our power to make sure our students and staff are safe and sound.

Next Saturday, the Quincy Catholic Educational School's Office is sponsoring their annual "Friends of Catholic Educational Dinner." The recipients of this award this year is the Western Catholic Union, a fraternal life insurance society that has done so much in support of our Catholic schools here in Quincy.
