Dear Parishioners,

This Fourth Sunday of Easter could very easily be coined as "Good Shepherd Sunday." This is evident from our gospel for this particular Sunday as Jesus states very emphatically that "I am the good Shepherd. A good shepherd lays down his life for the sheep. A hired man, who is not a shepherd and whose sheep are not his own, sees a wolf coming and leaves the sheep and runs away, and the wolf catches and scatters them. This is because he works for pay and has no concern for the sheep. I am the good shepherd, and I know mine and mine know me." In this beautiful statement, we have Jesus telling us in no uncertain terms that He was the one who gave His life for the sheep. This Jesus invested His very self in all of us, suffering, dying and rising, that we might finally grasp God's love for us through Jesus. Throughout my life, I could always tell the ones who invest themselves in the work that they do, and not just put in the hours to be paid. The former become like the shepherd as they put their very selves into their work or ministry, while the former workers do work but never invest themselves in the work that they do. And that is the difference we hear Jesus saying between the hired person and the shepherd who gives of Himself for all of us. In this beautiful image, Jesus helps us realize His unconditional love. His unconditional investment of Himself in each of our lives. Hopefully, you and I will appreciate this great gift revealed to us by Jesus, who gave of Himself totally for all of us, His sheep. May each of us be ever thankful to the God who loves and redeems us and saves us from ourselves.

With the permission of the Bishop Paprocki, I would like to announce some personnel changes that will affect St. Peter Church. As of July 1, 2018, Fr. Valery Burusu is being transferred to St. Mary Church, Paris, Illinois, and St. Aloysius Church, North Arm, as their new pastor. These two parishes are in the Decatur deanery and are located close to the Indiana border. In his place we are privileged to welcome Fr. Aaron Kuhn, a newly ordained priest of our diocese. Fr. Aaron Kuhn is currently at Mundelein Seminary, Mundelein, Illinois, and is from St. Francis Solanus Church, here in Quincy. We are so very happy to welcome him to St. Peter Church and pray that he will have a great first experience here with us. As you bid your farewells to Fr. Burusu, I hope also that you welcome with our hospitality Fr. Aaron Kuhn who will be serving our parish for the next several years.

I want to welcome in a special way our students from Quincy Notre Dame and their dates who are with us prior to their prom. What a special time for them and we are so very happy that they have chosen to join us for this celebration of the Eucharist. I ask you to pray for each of them that the Lord will keep them safe from all harm and will watch over them with His love and presence so that they have a great time and be free from all harm. May God bless them this evening.



Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ.

Here in the United States there is a great need for spreading the Gospel and sharing the message of Christ and the beauty of the Church. The Church at home needs to be strengthened and fortified. Soon, as a diocese, we will take up the Catholic Home Missions Appeal (CHMA), which supports the needlest dioceses in the United States. This appeal makes the most basic faith programs possible and shares the gospel message with our brothers and sisters in dioceses where Church communities are scattered and struggling.

An example of such a diocese is the Diocese of Pueblo. There are only 44 priests and 45 deacons available to serve the needs of over 64,000 Catholics. The diocese is primarily rural, covering the entire southern half of the state of Colorado, and the priest shortage is felt very strongly there. But with your support of CHMA, the Diocese of Pueblo offers lay ministry training programs. This training will provide ministers to serve the most isolated parishes and offer spiritual support for Catholics in the dio-
