Dear Parishioners,

Well this is our second weekend in our month of August. This means that this is the last week of summer vacation for our students. As we prepare ourselves for the close of this vacation, I ask you to remember in your prayers our administration, staff, teachers, and students as they make their final preparation for the opening of a new year of learning and Catholic formation.

Our gospel for this weekend continues the bold proclamation of Jesus as the bread of life. In this gospel, Jesus begins to lead the people from him being the “bread of life” as He fulfills all that we need in life to Jesus being the “living bread come down from heaven; whoever eats this bread will live forever; and the bread that I will give is my flesh for the life of the world.” In this proclamation, Jesus again boldly states that He is the living bread to be consumed and eaten by us—and that this bread is His flesh for the life of the world. Thus, we have the greatest Sacrament of the Catholic Church, namely, the Eucharist. It is amazing how Catholics can leave the Church for another faith denomination that excludes these very words of Jesus because they do not accept nor believe in the Eucharistic presence. What a joy then to proclaim this gospel because these very words identify us as a Eucharistic people who center their faith and lives on these very words. May Christ and His Eucharistic Presence be the source of all that we have and the food that sustains us in all that we do. Because as Jesus states, “whoever eats this bread will live forever.” Do you believe these words? If so, then the Eucharist must be the center of each of our lives each and every weekend.

This Wednesday is the Solemnity of the Assumption of Mary into heaven. According to the Catechism of the Catholic Church, it states: “Finally the Immaculate Virgin, preserved free from all stain of original sin, when the course of her earthly life was finished, was taken up body and soul into heavenly glory, and exalted by the Lord as Queen over all things, so that she might be the more fully conformed to her son, the Lord of lords and conqueror of sin and death. The Assumption of the Blessed Virgin is a singular participation in her son’s Resurrection and anticipation of the resurrection of other Christians.” In light of this Solemnity, our Mass schedule is as follows:

Tuesday, August 14th: Vigil Mass at 6:00 p.m

Wednesday, August 15th: Masses will be at 8:30, 12:10, and 5:30 p.m.

As we look ahead, we will have a Back to School Mass on Tuesday, August 21st, at 5:30 p.m. Then our first day of school will be on Wednesday, August 22nd. We want to welcome our students, both the new ones and our veterans, to our young and older students, to another years of learning and being formed by the gospel. This will be another exciting year with many challenges. I want our parents and students, teachers and staff, to be in one accord as we begin another year. May God bless you and keep you safe, growing in wisdom, knowledge, and grace.

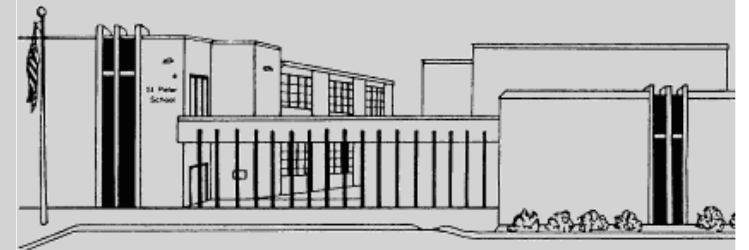
St. Peter Parish Picnic Silent Auction & Raffle Baskets

Parish in Action

Haiti Sister Parish Corner

In celebration of the upcoming Feast of Our Lady of the Assumption and the third anniversary of our Sister Parish relationship with Our Lady of the Assumption parish in Haiti, this weekend before each Mass we are showing a video of recent initiatives accomplished through your stewardship. They are:

- Parish Learning Center** - Several parishioners attended sewing and cooking classes. Many received new cooking pots as part of this initiative.
- Self-Sustainability Program** - Father Michel disbursed small loans to a number of parishioners to begin home-based businesses. For example, an individual may use the money to purchase rice in bulk, repackage and sell it at the local market. Father hopes to continue this program by offering similar opportunities to others.
- Education Scholarships** - Twenty-one students received scholarships from twenty-one St. Peter sponsors to attend school for the 2018-2019 school year. This is the second year for this program.
- Clean Water Program** - Over 60 clean water filtration systems have been distributed. One picture in the video shows a typical Haitian home where a water filtration system is being used.
- Construction** - A new choir loft is being built at Our Lady of the Assumption in Passe-Reine to free up space in the church proper for additional seating needed to accommodate an increase in parishioners. Renovation on the mission church in Garoty (not pictured) will be completed in September.
- Spiritual Life** - Haitian life is steeped in tradition. Mass can last 2-3 hours. Religion and the solemnity of the sacraments such as First Holy Communion and Matrimony are extremely important in the lives of the people. Two years ago fifty people were married in a single ceremony at Our Lady of the Assumption. In May twenty-five adults and children received the Eucharist for the first time.

We hope you enjoy the video this weekend. Father Michel will continue to share videos and pictures on the life of the parish. If you have any questions, please contact Marilena (430-8768). Thank you for your continued support of our Sister Parish.
