**Dear Parishioners,**

Today the Church celebrates the 33rd Sunday in ordinary time. This is the last weekend we will be vested in green vestments for a while. “Ordinary time” comes to an end next weekend as we celebrate the Solemnity of Christ the King. It is a Sunday that we are vested in white (gold) vestments. It is hard to believe that in two weeks the season of Advent will begin for us and the beginning of a new liturgical year in the life of the Church. This liturgical year is cycle C in our three year cycle of readings, cycle I in our weekday cycle, and is the year of St. Luke.

Our readings this weekend seem to concentrate on the end of time. Our first reading from the prophet Daniel seem to reflect a type of resurrection from the dead. These words far surpass the Jewish thought of the time. In this reading we hear “many of those who sleep in the dust of the earth shall awake; some shall live forever, and others shall be an everlasting horror and disgrace.” It sounds like a proclamation of heaven and hell. Whatever the case, on this 33rd Sunday the Church invites us to think beyond the experiences of this world and somehow prioritize our lives in terms of a life to come. In terms of this invitation, our responsorial psalm is a reminder when we pray today, “You are my inheritance, O Lord!” Do we believe that? If so, then “the wise shall shine brightly like the splendor of the firmament, and those who lead the many to justice shall be like the stars forever.”

Speaking of justice, the parish for whatever reason will be involved in an injustice. What I am speaking about concerns the visit by a hate group called the Westboro Baptist Church. If they show up, they are planning on picketing St. Peter Church along with Madison Park Christian Church and the Nazarene Church in Hannibal. For whatever reason, they have chosen our Churches to try to spread their vile and hatred towards groups of people with whom they despise. For us who believe in the dignity of all individuals, and who respect all God’s creation, their behavior truly violates the virtue of justice. As I said at the Masses last weekend, just smile and ignore their ignorance and they will soon go away. To do anything other than that leads into reactions that they seek and want in order to help subsidize in lawsuits such evil behavior. Again, please smile, ignore, and pray for them. Their behavior is not only far from being Christian it is also distant from being human to say the least.

This Thursday, November 22nd, is Thanksgiving Day and a national holiday for our country. Even though we celebrate it as a holiday, it is also a reminder that each day of our lives should be one of Thanksgiving. God has given us so much, blessed us with so many resources as a country, and gifted us with freedoms and individual rights, that each of us should always have a spirit of thankfulness. In fact, to remind us, the Church celebrates our Eucharist, a word which means thankfulness. Our Eucharist for Thanksgiving Day will be at 9:30 a.m. Please come and give thanks to our God in our greatest prayer of thanks, the Eucharist.


**QND Pom Pon Camp:**
