Fourth Sunday of Lent, March 31, 2019

Dear Parishioners,

On this last weekend in our month of March, the Church celebrates the Fourth Sunday in our season of Lent. Since this Fourth Sunday is the halfway point in this season of penitence and preparation for Easter, the Church invites us to pause and rejoice on this particular weekend. And so as tradition has it, this Fourth Sunday is called “Laetare Sunday,” a Latin word which means to “rejoice.” We rejoice first and foremost because our Elect, those who are to be baptized will soon celebrate with us the Sacraments of Initiation. We rejoice also that our candidates, those who were baptized in another faith tradition, will become one with us at the altar through their profession of faith. And we also rejoice because our Lenten preparation is almost complete and we will be renewing our baptismal vows, those promises that connect each of us with the very grace of God. As a sign of our rejoicing, the color of our celebration is that of rose, a color that is cheerful and a sign of new life and growth. May each of us rejoice today in the Lord’s choosing each of us to love us and to show His mercy upon each of us.

On this Fourth Sunday, we will have once again our second of three scrutinies, those prayers of the Church for our Elect and candidates. I ask your continual prayer for them as they have come a long way in their journey of faith in the Catholic Church and with God’s grace will complete their journey at the Easter Vigil.

This Sunday, March 31st, you are invited to Blessed Sacrament Church for our first of two city wide Reconciliation Services. This service will begin at 3:00 p.m. with a number of priests present to celebrate individual Confession and Absolution. Our final city wide service will be here at St. Peter Church on Palm Sunday, April 14th, also at 3:00 p.m. I remind you that we will be hearing Confessions from 5:45-6:15 each Monday, Wednesday, and Friday until Holy Week. Then in Holy Week, we will hear individual confessions on Good Friday, from 11:00-12:00, and then from 3:00-5:00 p.m. The same schedule will be on Holy Saturday also, but I’m asking you not to wait until the last days to reconcile and enjoy the mercy and forgiveness of our God.

This weekend Deacon Patrick O’Toole from the Office of the Missions in Springfield will be here to preach at all the Masses. Please give him your attention as he speaks to us of our responsibility to support the missionary effort of the Church. We know what this is about and have responded so well as is clear in our support of our sister parishes in Haiti. Fr. Delix recently visited us and I gave him another check for \$15,000 to take home with him to help our brothers and sisters who are in need. I continually thank you and know that God will truly reward us for what we do to the least of our brothers and sisters we do for Jesus Himself.

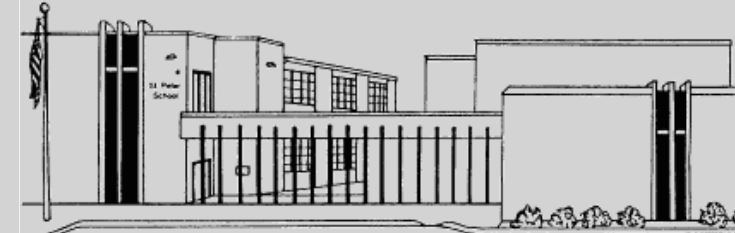
