Dear Parishioners,

On this last weekend in our month of April, the Church continues to celebrate the Easter mystery. On this particular weekend, April 27-28th, the Church has designated this Sunday as “Divine Mercy Sunday.” The reason for this designation is found in our gospel reading for this Mass. In the gospel of John, we find that the risen Christ appears to the apostle in the locked room. It is at this point that He shows them His hands and His side. Then Jesus states, “Peace be with you.” These words of comfort and relief were all that the apostles needed to hear. There were no judgements nor condemnation but only a sense of peace and joy given to them by the Risen Lord. Then what happens next is that Jesus gives to them the authority to extend His forgiveness to others, thus establishing the Sacrament of Reconciliation. Jesus states, “Receive the Holy Spirit. Whose sins you forgive are forgiven them, and whose sins you retain are retained.” Thus God’s Divine Mercy is now extended through the apostles and their successors to all generations of Catholics from this time forward. So often people question why tell our sins to a priest, and not directly to God. Well, it was God’s divine plan to extend His mercy to all people through the gift to forgive sins that He gave to the apostles and, in turn, to all bishops and priests. In His wisdom Jesus recognizes that the sense of peace that He wanted His people to have could only be received when people claim their sins, confess them to another, and then be forgiven in a formal way. Then and only then will we find that sense of peace that He wanted to give to His Church.

Once again as I reflect upon the celebrations of Holy Week, I am always amazed and appreciate our celebrations. I know that I am a little prejudiced but between the decorations, the music, and the attendance, I would say that we have some of the best liturgies for which I want to thank all those involved. It was great and I can’t thank you enough.

Just to let you know that we will be celebrating the Sacrament of Confirmation for our 8th grade students on Tuesday, May 14th. If any of our adults of our parish who have not been confirmed might be interested in receiving this Sacrament, please either call one of the priests or our DRE, Gina Bergman, here at the parish office.

As I stated last week, we shipped 12 barrels of all kinds of items along with 5 other boxes of things to our sister parish in Haiti. I want to thank our Haiti committee for packing and making ready these items to be shipped, along with all the people of the parish who helped fill our containers with differing items. I also want to thank Deacon Bob Lundberg and his wife, Mary Ann, for transporting these items to Nashville, Tennessee. What all of these efforts reflect to me is that it takes the entire parish and our commitment to our sister parishes to make this yearly event possible. Again, I am so very proud of this parish family who not only support our Church, but also involved themselves in supporting our sister parishes in Haiti. Thank you.

He moved to Quincy in 1991 to teach at Quincy Notre Dame, and from 1991-2009, he taught at QND, St. Peter School, and Blessed Sacrament (after the school consolidation) as well as serving as principal of St. Dominic School for two years. For the past ten years, he has worked for the City of Quincy in both the Treasurer's Office and the Transit Department.

When he's not working, you may find him walking all over the south side of the city, coaching either a youth basketball or baseball game, attending a QND sporting event, announcing a QND football or basketball game, playing with his cat Lucky, cheering on his favorite teams -the Chicago Cubs and the Michigan Wolverines- or attending a concert of his favorite 1980's bands with his friends. Currently he is the coach of the boys QCES 7th grade basketball team and he is helping coach a 12U baseball team at the park district this spring.
