Dear Parishioners,

On this last weekend of May, the Church celebrate the Sixth Sunday of Easter. In our gospel for this celebration, we find Jesus preparing the apostles for His departure in the Ascension. He states, "I am going away and I will come back to you." Then Jesus reassures them that "the Advocate, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in my name will teach you everything and remind you of all that I told you." Not sure to what extent they understood these words, but they were told to them so that the apostles knew and understood that Jesus was not going to abandon them. He would be leaving but would be present to them in a different way. Even though the apostles did not fully understand but they would recall these words and be assured of them when questions arose, or uncertainties were experienced. He tells them, "do not let you hearts be troubled or afraid. If you loved me, you would rejoice that I am going to the Father, for the Father is greater than I." As Jesus prepares the apostles, we will find His words being fulfilled as we celebrate next weekend the Solemnity of the Ascension of Jesus into heaven. It has been customary for years to celebrate this departure 40 days after Easter, calling it in fact, Ascension Thursday. However, since it is such an important celebration, and since many Catholics failed to celebrate it on Thursday, 40 days after Easter, many dioceses transferred this Solemnity to a Sunday. And so the province of Illinois, the six Catholic dioceses, celebrate the Solemnity of the Ascension on a Sunday, replacing the 7th Sunday of Easter, in order to give this celebration the solemnity that it deserves.

This Monday, May 27th, is Memorial Day and a national holiday. It is always customary on this holiday to gather in Calvary Cemetery to remember our dead. The origin of this day was to remember in particular those who gave their lives in service to our country. And that we still do each and every Memorial Day. But we also have expanded it to include those who are buried in our cemeteries as well as for all of our brothers and sisters who have died. Perhaps the most important thing that we can do for our deceased is to remember them in prayer. And so this Monday, May 27th, we will gather to celebrate a Mass of Remembrance for all of our deceased at 9:30 a.m. I ask you to bring you lawn chairs and/or blankets and join us as a community of believers to celebrate this Mass. In case of inclement weather, we will transfer our celebration to St. Francis Church who is in charge of our liturgy this year. Come and join us as we remember.

Monday, June 3rd, is our last day of school for St. Peter School. We will have a concluding Mass at 8:30 a.m. followed by a school picnic. One of the things that I always emphasize is that even though we have a summer break from school, there is NO SUMMER BREAK FROM OUR FAITH AND LIVING THAT FAITH. I do expect to continue to see our families at Church every weekend.

Just to let you know, as of July 1, 2010, I have been officially appointed by the Bishop as chaplain at Quincy Notre Dame. Since I have been assuming this position for the past 8 years, it really doesn't mean much other than another title behind my name. But now it's official!

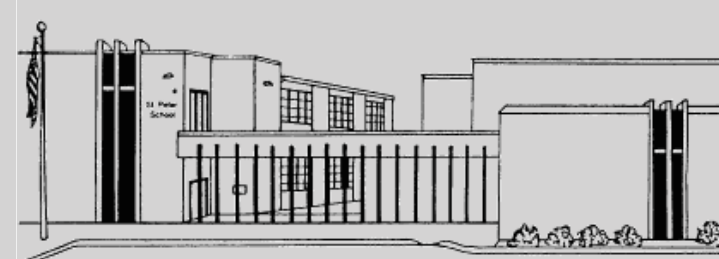
