## Dear Parishioners,

*“When the time for Pentecost was fulfilled, they were all in one place together. And suddenly there came from the sky a noise like a strong driving wind, and it filled the entire house in which they were. Then there appeared to them tongues as of fire, which parted and came to rest on each one of them. And they were all filled with the Holy Spirit.”* This reading from the Acts of the Apostles conveys to us the beginning of the Church as we celebrate this day the Solemnity of Pentecost. Today is the birth day of our Catholic Church. It is on this particular day that the promised Spirit is given to the apostles and their successors as a reassurance that Jesus has not left them alone, but through this gift continues to guide, direct, and reassure them that He remains with His Church. In the Nicene Creed, we call the Holy Spirit the “Lord, and giver of life.” When Jesus returned to the Father in the Ascension, one would have expected His Body on earth, the apostles and disciples, would have ceased to exist. Instead, the “giver of Life,” comes to them on Pentecost to continue to breathe new life in the apostles and disciples so that they could continue the ministry of Jesus. Jesus’ Body was present, alive and active, through this gift of the Holy Spirit. And it is this same Holy Spirit that continues today to guide, direct, and empower the Church to continue the mission of Jesus here on earth. *“Come, Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of the faithful and continue to enkindle the fire of your love, present and active today in our Church.”*

With our celebration of the Solemnity of Pentecost, we bring to a close our Easter season. This means the decorations which so beautifully enhanced our celebrations of this great mystery, will now come down as we enter into that time in our liturgical calendar called “Ordinary time.” The reason it is called “ordinary” is that there is no special celebration in the life of Christ but ordinary time are moments of grace as we celebrate who we are as Church. The color of “ordinary” time is green, a sign of growth and life. Just as I say this, the next two Sundays celebrate two Feasts on our Church, the Feast of the Holy Trinity, and the Feast of the Body and Blood of Christ. But we are still in “Ordinary Time.”

Well, for the students of St. Peter school, summer vacation has officially began as of Monday, last week. I ask the prayers of all our parishioners to watch over our students of our parish and keep them safe from all harm. May the Holy Spirit who came that first Pentecost, inspire these young people to keep their faith alive and active in their lives, celebrating each weekend the greatest mystery of our life, namely, our Eucharist.

Once again to make sure that our parishioners are aware, I will be leaving on Monday, June 17th, to head to Chicago as I will fly out on Tuesday, June 18th for Frankfurt, Germany. Eventually for the next six days, we will be touring Lourdes and Fatima, along with Madrid, and Santiago. I will be returning on Wednesday, June 26th, via Toronto, Canada. I ask your prayers while I am away from the parish. I will in particular ask Our Lady of Fatima and Lourdes to be ever watchful over St. Peter Church and parishioners. This will be a first time experience in these places of honor and I hope and pray that it will be a very rewarding and enriching experience for me.
