Dear Parishioners,

We gather this weekend on the 20th Sunday in Ordinary Time. I want you to picture yourself as a follower of Jesus in the first or second century. From your earliest days you were a faithful Jew, someone whose Jewish faith was cherished and followed. Then this man Jesus changed everything for you and you began to believe in Him as the Messiah for whom you hoped. He taught you much about your Jewish tradition, helped to enlighten you to what it means to be a child of God, and made promises for which you never heard, like eternal life with Him. Even after His suffering and dying, you heard about the resurrection, a life for which you hoped. And so you became more and more firm in your faith in Him. Then all of a sudden the Jewish leaders said that anyone who followed Jesus was excommunicated from the Temple, the synagogue, and Jewish life. With this declaration you were literally disowned by your Jewish family, and since the Jewish faith was tolerated by the Romans, you were now considered outside this faith and now fair game to persecution and death. I bring this to your attention because it is the basis of what Jesus was saying in the gospel. “Do you think that I have come to establish peace on earth? No, I tell you, but rather division.” Households were now divided, family members against family members. This was not an easy time for being a convert from Judaism to following Jesus, and yet so many did as they “kept their eyes fixed on Jesus, the leader and perfecter of faith.” (2nd reading) Was it easy, no way. But in this same second reading the writer tells them, “consider how Jesus endured such opposition from sinners in order that you may not grow weary and lose heart.” So when our lives are difficult, are faith is in question, let’s realize that others have endured the same and remember those words from Hebrews.


Ladies of Charity-Gifts from the Garden


