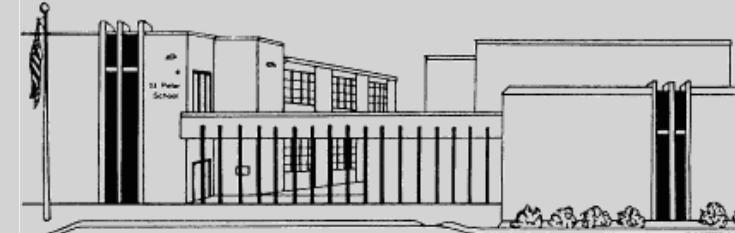
Protecting God's Children Classes at Blessed Sacrament

Thanks to the continuing sister parish relationship between the Church of St. Peter and Our Lady of the Assumption Church in Haiti, 12 parishioners received the Eucharist for the first time at the newly renovated mission church in Garoty.

As you may recall, this spring we sent 12 barrels and 5 boxes of much needed items to Haiti. Father Michel drove to Port-au-Prince in June to pick up the shipment. In addition to the personal care products, socks, underwear, medical supplies and sporting equipment, we shipped two canopy-style tents. The Garoty parishioners used them during the recent First Communion celebration.
