Dear Parishioners,

As we begin this first weekend of August, my first reaction is “what happened to summer?” It’s hard to believe that summer is over, at least in terms of returning to school. The weather might not agree, as the heat and humidity will remain. But at least our students and teachers will be more comfortable this year with our new ac/heating system that was installed this summer. I can personally say that it is quite comfortable in the classroom setting and our students will no longer use the excuse its too hot to be in school. Again this project occurred because of your sense of stewardship for this parish, and our parishes’ dedication to Catholic education as a mission of our Church.

In my understanding of stewardship, God has blessed us with the three “t” gifts, namely, time, talents, and treasures. Yes, we are expected to use the time that we have, the talents that God has given us, and to share the treasures that have grown from the time and talents. In our gospel today, we are confronted with the parable of the rich man who forgot, or didn’t remember how God blessed him with these three “t”s. Instead of recognizing how God blessed him, he decided to horde things only for himself. The harvest was rich and so he decides to keep it to himself. What he failed to realize was a need to be thankful and to return to God a share of that harvest. Instead, he tears down the old barns and builds new ones in order to keep things to himself and be secure for many years. What is interesting is the response of God to this type of hoarding, “you fool, this very night your life will be demanded of you, and the things you have prepared, to whom will they belong?” Then Jesus concludes this parable with the striking statement, “This will be for all who store up treasure for themselves but are not rich in what matters to God.” What we have received in terms of time, talents, and treasures, we are to return to our God who blessed us with them.

As you know, Fr. Augustine Tolton, a former member of St. Peter Church has been raised to the title of “Venerable” in the process of canonization. What a beautiful tribute to the first African American Priest to serve the Catholic Church. We can take much pride in Fr. “Gus,” as he is affectionately called. Fr. Gus is currently buried in St. Peter Cemetery. Many people come and visit his grave and as he gets closer to being declared a saint, the traffic will increase. But the roads in the cemetery do not reflect well upon the cemetery nor the Church which bears its name. In an effort to improve our image and the roads, we are getting bids for this road work. The last bid was for \$17,000. Not sure if that will change, but I committed our Church to paying for half in an effort to make our roads presentable (\$8500). Then I personally agreed from my own stewardship to contribute \$4200 to this project. The cemetery itself will cover the other fourth. If anyone would like to assist us in making this temporary burial place a true place of honor for our saint to be, please place your contribution in an envelope and mail it to the rectory or put it in the collection. If you have ever been to St. Peter Cemetery, you will realize from where I speak. His canonization might take several months, or maybe several years, we just don’t know. But it does say St. Peter Cemetery and I don’t want anything that bears our name to be anything less than honorable.


