Dear Parishioners,

This weekend the Church celebrates the Third Sunday in Ordinary Time. Our second reading is rather interesting. Paul confronts a reality in the Corinthian Church. The reality is a division within the community based upon the personality of some of the leaders. Some of the community members were name droppers, and took pride in people to whom they felt a sense of belonging. Some of these leaders were better preachers than others, some probably more pastoral than others and so allegiances were formed around the personality of these individuals. Therefore, rivalries developed with some saying that “I belong to Paul,” or others, “I belong to Apollos,” still others saying “I belong to Cephas,” and finally others proclaiming “I belong to Christ.” Paul reminds them that Jesus Christ is not divided and that there should be no divisions among them. Yes, as Paul tells them, that Christ was crucified for all of them, and it is in Jesus Christ that they find their purpose. And it is Jesus who sends them all forward, preaching the gospel not with the “wisdom of human eloquence,” but with the cross of Jesus always in the forefront. I find some tremendous wisdom in this reading. Not every priest can preach like Bishop Fulton Sheen, not every priest can be as pastoral as St. John Vianney, but every priest is called by Jesus to allow the grace of Christ to be present and become his instruments to help people grow in their faith. This reading is very important to me personally as I realize my own inabilities but in spite of that, God is still able to work in and through me. And my response always is “thanks be to God” for working in and through me.

This reflection is so apropos to our gospel for this weekend. In that gospel Jesus calls Peter and Andrew, James and John, to leave their nets and to follow Him. Jesus saw something in each of them, something unique and special. And since Jesus sees beyond human appearances, sees beyond human flaws, He called each of them to give Him their time and talents, and Jesus would mold and fashion them to be His followers. That doesn’t mean that they did not once in a while get in the way, as we all do, but nevertheless, they learned to empty themselves to follow Him. And each priest often learns that lesson well.

One of the gifts that we have been given by those who established St. Peter Church many years ago is the gift of Catholic education. Providing Catholic education by our forefathers was considered to be a central mission of the Church. Catholic schools were established to preserve and promote the teachings of the Catholic Church since the public schools were so often the arm of the Protestant Churches and their teachings. Our Catholic School system today still is a mission of the Catholic Church and we need to continue to support and promote our schools in order to preserve the long tradition of our Church. Besides our grade school system, we also are gifted with secondary Catholic education with the long tradition of Quincy Notre Dame. I bring all this to your attention as we celebrate National Catholic School’s Week. At all of our Masses this weekend, our students will be taking an active role. Throughout this week, there will be many other activities as we celebrate who we are and the role that we have in our community and in our nation. Please join us whenever you can as we make this week something very special for our school and our parish.

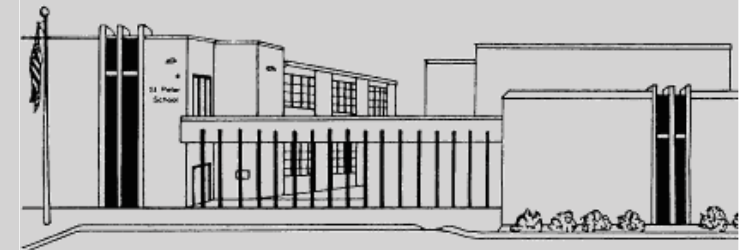
