Dear Parishioners

This weekend, we celebrate the Fifth Sunday in our season of Lent. If you have our missalettes, you will notice that it's the last weekend for the missalettes currently being used. Next Friday, we will put out the new ones for Holy Week and Easter. For those who have the ones in current use, I ask you to recycle them in our container in the back. Thank you.

Usually on this particular Sunday we would celebrate our Third and Final scrutiny for our Elect (those not baptized). However, since our one Elect is unable to make it to our 9:30 a.m. Mass for this week, we will be using the regular readings from the Year B. In light of that, our readings for our Mass today prepare the way for Holy Week. We have the gospel of St. John which has Jesus telling the apostles, "the hour has come for the Son of Man to be glorified." Not understanding what that meant, Jesus then tells them the "unless the grain of wheat falls to the ground and died, it remains just a grain of wheat; but if it dies, it produces much fruit." That one phrase helps us understand what Jesus was saying about being glorified. He was predicting His death on the cross, the grain of His life dying; but when it dies, it produces much fruit, namely, the resurrection. Then He goes on to say that He was troubled but that this was the purpose for which He came, to save us as the perfect sacrifice, thus paving the way to the new life in the resurrection. Then He states, "and when I am lifted up from the earth, I will draw everyone to myself." As we enter into Holy Week next weekend, let each of us draw ourselves into the Passion, Death, and Resurrection of Jesus so that each of us has that hope of new life in Christ because of what Jesus has done for us.

As I announced last weekend and will do so this weekend at my Masses, we will no longer be having people signing up to attend a Mass. The reason for this change is that the Bishop will be lifting his dispensation from attendance on Sundays as of April 10-11, 2021. What does this mean? It means that we will be obliged once again to celebrate our Eucharist on Sundays. Now even though the general dispensation is lifted, there is what is called a particular dispensation that is given for those who are the most vulnerable with regard to the virus, those who might be fearful and guided by that fear for a variety of reasons, or those who might not be feeling well. In those instances, they are excused. If anyone is unsure and is guided by fear, I can easily grant him/her a dispensation. All one has to do is call and ask. But our Church will be opening up for a bigger attendance for our people. I am planning on removing the ribbons that are on every other pew in the two middle sections of the Church. Just be aware of this reality when you find a pew. However, those who desire to social distancing themselves, the sections of the pews on both the north and south side of the Church will be available with the ribbons still on the pews. In the meantime, I still ask you to wear your masks for the sake of your neighbor, not whether you believe in their effectiveness or not. "Whatever you do for the least of our brothers and sisters (who might be fearful) we do for Christ Himself." Again, where possible, we are still encouraged to social distance ourselves, wear our masks, and wash our hands. So far we have been safe and our track record shows it. Thank you!


CYO Registration for Sand Volleyball & Kickball
