
### Dear Parishioners,

At one time in our liturgical calendar, this weekend was celebrated as the Seventh Sunday of Easter. Because the Solemnity of the Ascension was losing its significance since it was celebrated 40 days after Easter, always on a Thursday, there were many dioceses in the United States which decided to transfer it to this weekend instead of during the week. And so the entire province of Illinois, the six dioceses, transferred this Solemnity to this particular weekend, foregoing the celebration of the Seventh Sunday of Easter. And that is where we find ourselves this weekend as we celebrate the Solemnity of the Ascension. But there still are dioceses that continue the Ascension on a Thursday, 40 days after Easter, taking quite literally the words found in the Acts of the Apostles for this Solemnity, "He presented himself alive to them by many proofs after He had suffered, appearing to them during forty days and speaking about the kingdom of God." Now we might ask which is right? And the answer is both. It really doesn't matter when this Solemnity is celebrated, be it a Thursday or on the following weekend, what is important is that it is celebrated and people are being present for the celebration. And that is the key and that is why both understandings are correct.

One of the mistaken notions of this Solemnity is that we envision Jesus pushing off from this earth and ascending into the heavens. If we believe in this understanding, then heaven becomes a place up in space, far beyond where anyone has ever gone. Heaven becomes up there, hell becomes someplace down there, and earth seems to be in between. It becomes a type of three-story universe. If that is the case, then Jesus is way beyond us, a notion contrary to what the Ascension is trying to teach us. Instead, Jesus enters the cloud of God's glory. Christ is "seated above every principality and power" but it does not mean that He is far away. The Solemnity of the Ascension teaches us that Jesus has entered into a new dimension, the dimension of glory, but He is still present to us. And so Jesus is not far away, but He remains still with us through His Church, His Word, and His Sacraments. May the Ascension be the stimulus that we need to take the Words of Jesus found in our gospel for this Solemnity as He tells the disciples and all of us, "Go into the whole world and proclaim the gospel to every creature. Whoever believes and is baptized will be saved." So now we have our marching orders as we begin to live what it means to be His Church.

Our 8th grade graduation/promotion will be this Tuesday, May 18th, at 6:30 p.m. in St. Peter Church. This has been a difficult year for our 8th graders as they lost their class trip to Washington D.C. because of the pandemic and had to do some virtual learning outside the classroom. But they have been very cooperative and I am so proud of them and the way that they handled the struggles these past 18 months. I ask that you keep them in your prayers as they prepare to leave our school for years of learning on the high school level. I also remind them that this graduation/promotion is not from their Catholic faith but only from the grade school learning environment.

Our last day of school for St. Peter School will be Wednesday, May 26th. We hope to have a Mass at 11:00 a.m. outside to close out our school year.

We feel very appreciated and loved. Our St. Peter School family is truly amazing and we all feel very Blessed to be a part of it!


### STEM - A NEW PROGRAM FOR 2021-2022
