The Most Holy Trinity Solemnity, May 30, 2021

Dear Parishioners,

With the celebration of the Solemnity of Pentecost, the Church has resumed to “Ordinary Time” in our liturgical calendar. As previously discussed, “ordinary time” is that time in the Church calendar when no particular moment or aspect of the Christian mystery is celebrated. Now there are two phases of this “ordinary time,” a shorter one in winter between the season of Christmas and the season of Lent. With Pentecost, we enter into the longer phase through the summer and fall between the seasons of Easter and the season of Advent. The color for all “ordinary time” is green, a sign of hope and new life. However, just when I share this with you, you will find the priest wearing white vestments and not celebrating the Sundays of “Ordinary time.” This is because the next two Sundays, we celebrate two differing Solemnities in the mystery of our faith, namely the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity (our celebration this weekend) and the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ (our celebration next weekend). Then finally on June 13th, we return to the 11th Sunday in Ordinary time. But as a reminder, the weekday liturgies when not celebrating a saint will be the days of Ordinary time.

On this Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity, we celebrate the most fundamental mystery of our faith, namely, that in God, there are three Divine Persons, the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. How they fit together, we will never understand as we will never comprehend how God can be one Divine Being even though there are three Persons, distinct, equal and yet one God. There are not three separate intelligences or wills in the one God. When one Person of the Trinity acts, the other two Persons also act. Each Person is distinct but does not act separately from the others. God is one, a community in unity. And into this community are we drawn to live, also a community in unity with each other. To the extent that we live in this type of love, to that extent are we getting a little glimpse of what awaits us in heaven. In that simple sign of the cross comes a rich tradition and proclamation of mystery as we pray and worship, “*in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.*” Suffice it to say, our Triune God is a mystery to be lived and celebrated but never understood.

This Monday, May 31st, is Memorial Day. As is the custom here in Quincy, we will have only one Mass that day and that Mass will be celebrated at Calvary Cemetery at 9:00 a.m. St. Peter’s is in charge of the liturgy this year so I’m encouraging our parishioners to come and celebrate, bringing your blankets and/or lawn chairs and praying for all the deceased buried in our cemeteries as well as all those who gave their lives in the service of our country. If the weather is inclement, then we will move this Mass back to St. Peter Church. Let’s pray for good weather as we missed this celebration last year because of the virus.

I remind you that between now and sometime in July we will have to make our way through the closure of Maine Street. To access our parking lot in the front of the Church or behind the school, please make use of the Madison Park Street from 24th. Unfortunately we will not be able to use the other parking lots near the cafeteria, Seton Hall, or behind the rectory. Please be patient.


WCU Spaghetti Luncheon
