Dear Parishioners

We gather this weekend to celebrate the Sixth Sunday of Easter. Our gospel for this weekend challenges us "to love." We might think that this is easy and comes quite natural in our human condition. But the added touch that Jesus presents is not to "love as we love", which is often so conditional and dependent upon our feelings. Rather, Jesus says "love one another as I love you." Now this challenge becomes rather difficult and trying. For the words of Jesus challenges us to look in our lives in how Jesus has loved us, even to the point of looking upon the crucifix and Church and seeing the depth of His love for us. This is the type of love to which He challenges us. Now this is not easy, and is not natural to our human condition. For who among us would lay down our lives for another. But the beautiful part of this challenge is the presence of God's grace. With His grace in our lives, all things are possible as is evidence of this type of love in the lives of all the saints.

The beautiful part of living this type of love in our lives is found also in the words of Jesus in this gospel. Jesus states "I have told you this so that my joy may be in you and your joy might be complete." When we accept the challenge to live this type of love, we will find a joy that makes all of our lives complete. I was thinking about this idea of love last Friday. The seventh of May was my mother's birthday. She would have been 100 years of age had she lived. But as I was thinking about her and her life, especially as we celebrate Mother's Day this weekend, I concluded that there was never more of an example of Jesus' challenge of love than in my mother. And perhaps each of you could say the same about your mothers. Was my mother perfect? Not hardly but I also know that she would have laid down her life for me and often did especially when I needed her the most in my sickness. When I was very young, I was inflicted with a number of childhood disease at the same time, causing me to be in complete isolation and a question whether I would survive. Through her prayer and love, as you can see, I did. This Mother's Day I recall the words of Jesus in our gospel who said, "No one has greater love than this, to lay down one's life for one's friends." For the love made incarnate in her life for me, for the love of all the mother's of our parish family, let us, their children, thank God for this special gift. I heard it once said that God could not be everywhere so He created mothers. And to all the mothers of our parish, Happy Mother's Day. And to all mothers who are deceased, we pray that their joy of motherhood is now complete as they prayerfully live with our God, the source of love, for eternity.

We will have our closing Mass for our PSR program this Wednesday, May 12th, at 6:30 p.m. in the Church. Parents and students are expected to be present. As we close out the school year, I remind them that even though they will not be having class, there is no vacation from the active practices of their faith. So I expect to see you with your families at Church on the weekends.

Then on Thursday, May 13th, we will be hosting the Quincy Notre Dame Baccalaureate mass at 7:00 p.m. I ask your prayers for our seniors at QND as well as Quincy High School as they begin a new journey in their young lives.

Heart Check for Tim


