Eleventh Sunday in Ordinary Time, June 13, 2021

Dear Parishioners,

Even though we have returned to “Ordinary Time” after Pentecost, this is the first weekend that we are actually celebrating it as a time in our Church calendar. We interrupted this time with Trinity Sunday and then Corpus Christi while the weekdays we were celebrating “Ordinary time.” And so we gather to celebrate the 11th Sunday in this “Ordinary Time.” This time is sometimes called the season of the Church, and what that means in all of our lives.

There are certain Scripture readings in which we can take comfort and encouragement. So often our lives can be difficult, crosses come our way, and we often are filled with discouragement let alone despair. In the midst of the confusion of our lives, our second reading from Paul’s second letter to the Corinthians helps us keep things in the right perspective. Paul provides an insight into our human condition. He states that “we are always courageous, although we know that while we are at home in the body, we are away from the Lord, we walk by faith and not by sight.” In other words, there are certain things in life for which we will never understand. In times of uncertainty, Paul encourages us to remain courageous even though we don’t understand all the complexities of living. He tells us to trust, to have faith, for this is how we are to walk. Someday he reminds us that we will walk by sight but in the meantime, to walk by faith with eyes always on what will last forever, namely, life with our God in heaven. And so in the midst of uncertainties, doubts, and even despair, Paul encourages us like he did the Corinthians to “aspire to please our Lord, whether we are at home or away.” In doing so, we will profess that in coming before the Lord on judgement day, that we will receive the proper recompense for how we lived. May each of us embrace these words, celebrate and live them while we walk by faith away from the Lord.

Just a reminder to our parishioners that ACSA, aka Annual Catholic Services Appeal, is no longer the money appeal in support of the diocese. This was an 11% tax to each parish to support the diocesan services and offices. Now, with the diocese encouraging stewardship, they have titled this support the “Parish Community Tithe.” This means that every parish is expected to tithe (10% of their income) to the diocese to support its efforts. And so there will be no collection for this but instead parishioners are asked to contribute to the parish who in turn will tithe to the diocese an amount that is determined from a previous year according to a 10% tithe. Our tithe this year as determined by the diocese will be \$149,024 based on a 10% yearly income of a year ago.

In his column in Catholic Times, Bishop Paprocki writes: “in light of the State of Illinois entering Phase 5 on June 11th, which means that everyone can resume to full capacity for the first time since the onset of COVID-19 pandemic, I have withdrawn all remaining particular dispensations from the obligation to attend Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation, and I have issued a decree to that effect on the Feast of the Immaculate Heart of Mary, Saturday, June 12, 2021. Those who believe they should continue to be dispensed should speak to their parish priest who may grant a dispensation in individual cases for a just reason. Those who are ill are excused and do not need a dispensation.”

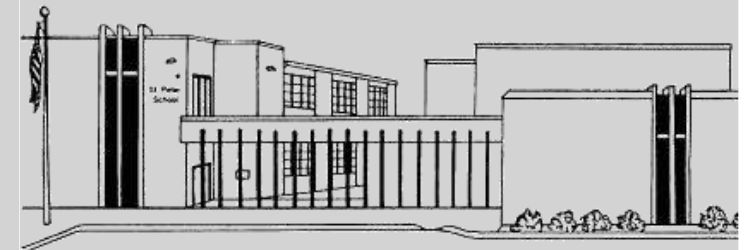

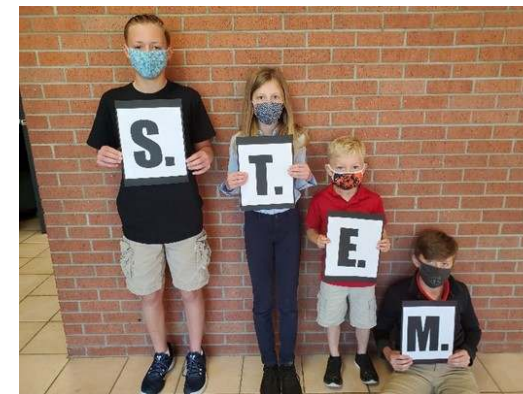
