Dear Parishioners,


Well the month of August has arrived. I'm not sure I'm ready for it as I have been enjoying the summer break. It seems like during the summer months, things in the parish slow down a little and life becomes a little more relaxing. But that soon will come to an end as we anticipate the beginning of a new school year.

This weekend we celebrate the 18th Sunday in Ordinary Time. The theme of our first reading and gospel is that God provides for all the hungers that we have in life. In our first reading from the Book of Exodus, we find the people grumbling in the desert for food. In response, God gives to them manna, bread from heaven. In the evening God gives to them quail so that their hunger was satisfied. Then we find in our gospel, Jesus providing for the hungers of the people. He had just fed the 5000 men and their families with five barley loaves and two fish. Now we find Jesus reflecting upon this miracle of multiplication and challenging the people, "Do not work for food that perishes but for the food that endures for eternal life, which the Son of Man will give you." Then Jesus goes into a discussion of this food, concluding with those beautiful words for us to ponder when the people ask Him, "Sir, give us this bread always." In response Jesus says, "I am the bread of life; whoever comes to me will never hunger, and whoever believed in me will never thirst." My brothers and sisters, this is the Eucharist, this is the bread and wine that Jesus offers us and changes into His very Body and Blood, the food for eternal life. The sacrament of the Eucharist is the most important sacrament as it gives to us the very food for this journey on earth. As we cannot sustain ourselves by our own measures, Jesus gives us the very food that satisfies the hungers for all that we need to find truth, happiness, joy, and love. What more could we ever want?

With a sigh of relief, we finally have Maine Street restored to its proper order. For almost two years, this main thoroughfare was torn up, replacing sewers, curbing, sidewalks, and the paving of the street itself. Thankfully, this has come to a conclusion and we are able to use it for both parking and access to our Church. Between COVID and this street construction, we've had many obstacles keeping many of our parishioners from attending Mass. Hopefully, this has come to an end and there will be no more excuses along these lines.

As we look forward, I want to remind you of our parish picnic on Saturday, August 28th. I know our picnic committee has been meeting, planning and coordinating the many events for this evening. We were unable to enjoy this picnic last year so we are more than ready and willing to gather to celebrate this annual event. I'm asking many of you to volunteer to help make this event a memorable experience for all visitors. If you are choose not to attend, I ask you at least to purchase some raffle tickets that were sent to you. It is in this way that we continue to support this annual endeavor. 

As many of you know from the past, the diocese operated from the annual appeal called the "Annual Catholic Services Appeal" or ACSA for short. Each parish was assessed a goal based upon a percentage of revenue established by the diocese for its operations. And each year you received a letter from the Bishop asking for your generosity. In response, many of you sent your monies to the diocese as a means of support. Well, the diocese has gone from ACSA to what is called the parish tithe. No longer will you send monies directly to the diocese but hopefully the same monies will be given to the parish because each parish in the diocese will be expected to tithe from its revenue on a monthly basis. Unlike ACSA which was more of a 11.4% tax, now the parish tithe is a 10% monthly gift to assist the diocese. So I ask you to continue your support of the diocese through your tithe to the parish. Thank you.
