Dear Parishioners.

It's hard to believe that this is the second week in our month of July. It seems that this weekend, unfortunately, marks the downward side of our summer vacation. If you haven't noticed, we have moved the statue of Venerable Augustine Tolton. It is now in a more prominent place. Before the statue was placed in front of the school often becoming lost in the plants and blending in with the building. But now anyone can see it from most of the parking lot as we come into the Church. Needless to say, one of my biggest worries was moving the statue without damaging it. And so we asked John Rupp, Rupp Masonry, and his son, Bryce, to move that statue since they had the equipment to do it. With the grace of God, the prayers of Venerable Augustine Tolton, and the expertise of the Rupp family, we moved it into its proper place without any incident. Furthermore, to highlight our past, we also moved the old concrete bench that had pieces of the old St. Peter Church that was destroyed in 1945. Assisting us with this move was also Randy Martin and Eric McNay from our staff. This whole project of moving the statue was the idea of a parishioner for whom I will be forever grateful. In conjunction with this move, the girl scout troop 5095 approached me with a service project, to create a butterfly garden somewhere on campus. So we decided to merge the two projects. And so what we have will be a prominent place for Venerable Augustine Tolton, surrounded by some landscaping that will highlight the area even more. The girl scouts enlisted the help of Carol Raker from Creative Garden Services, who volunteered her services, and chose the plants and their placement, and with the help of parents were able to complete this project before the Tolton pilgrimage on Friday, July 9th. It is a project to honor and highlight one of our own who some day will be recognized in the Communion of Saints. In the meantime, this particular area will help us remember him, and with the memorial wall with its plaques, will help us also remember his life and the many challenges that he faced. Venerable Augustine Tolton, pray for us.



I write to you one last time as the Area Director of Quincy Catholic Charities. I am very honored to have served in this capacity for the last 13 years and am equally honored to now serve the agency as the Director of Operations. In my 13 years, one theme that abounds is how the communities we serve really deserve to know more about the organization and the great work that is being done; quietly, behind the scenes in the vast 15,000 square miles within the 28-county diocese.

Catholic Charities of the Springfield Diocese has 7 local offices, and an administrative office in Springfield to serve the needs of the local offices. We offer 28 different programs agency-wide and each local office has a variety of programming that 1) fits the needs of the community and 2) can be sustained through various funding sources. Each local office has an Advisory Board to guide decisions and serve as the eyes and ears to the needs of the community. Each local office has an annual operating budget and dollars donated and raised within the office stay in that local office.

The mission of the agency is from the beautiful Catholic Doctrine that teaches us "to extend to all the healing and empowering presence of Jesus" through ministries that support the dignity and sanctity of human life at all stages; value families and the sacredness of marriage and work to strengthen them; and provide hope and help to those in need. Professional Counseling Solutions

The Professional Counseling Solutions Program provides individual, premarital, marital, and family therapy from a systemic perspective. Services are based on a sliding fee scale and clients are not refused due to their inability to pay. School Counseling is also available in the parochial school system.

Intact Family Services

Intact Family Services is a state contracted service to mitigate further child abuse and neglect. The goal of the program is to keep the family unit intact, while addressing issues that perpetuate abuse and neglect. Families in Adams, Brown, Cass, Hancock, Pike and Schuyler Counties are accepted on a referral basis from the Department of Children and Family Services. MedAssist Program

The MedAssist Program has two main components. The traditional program assists individuals in leveraging long-term prescription medications by accessing assistance programs through the pharmaceutical companies. The second component offers additional assistance to help with immediate medication costs/co-pays, depending on the situation. The target population of the MedAssist program are those who have no, or limited, prescription drug coverage. Food Pantry & Mobile Food Pantry

The food pantry strives to provide supplemental food to individuals and families that present for assistance and who meet the Department of Human Services requirements. Quincy Catholic Charities is a member of the Central Illinois Food Bank and also participates in the Feeding America Program sponsored by Wal-Mart. The food pantry is open every Monday from 2:00 pm-3:30 pm, every Wednesday from 9:00am-11:30am and every Friday from 2:00 pm-3:30 pm. Clients may receive food one time per month. The Mobile Food Pantry delivers a 2-week supply of food to rural pockets of the diocese. Mobile Food Pantry Services have been established for rural communities in Adams, Brown and Pike Counties and deliveries are made two times a month on a rotating basis to identified towns in these counties.
