Dear Parishioners,

This weekend we celebrate one of the holydays of obligation within our Church calendar. Today is the Solemnity of the Assumption of Mary into heaven. Since this solemnity falls on a Sunday anyway, it still remains a special holyday only celebrated on a Sunday. According to the Catechism of the Catholic Church, this Solemnity celebrates the following:

Finally the Immaculate Virgin, preserved free from all stain of original sin, when the course of her earthly life was finished, was taken up body and soul into heavenly glory, and exalted by the Lord as Queen over all things, so that she might be the more fully conformed to her Son, the Lord of lords and conqueror of sin and death. The Assumption of the Blessed Virgin is a singular participation in her Son's Resurrection and an anticipation of the resurrection of other Christians.


In our gospel for this Solemnity and reflecting upon who Mary is, perhaps the most appropriate words of Mary ring true through the mouth of Elizabeth who said upon Mary's arrival for her visit, "Blessed are you among women, and blessed is the fruit of your womb." Because of Jesus, her Son, and because of her willingness to do God's will in her life in giving birth to Jesus, we firmly believe that Mary was free from sin, and thus upon the end of her life, was the first to rise with her Son, being assumed Body and Soul into heaven to join Him forever.

As we begin our new school year, I remind our parishioners that since we are still trying to social distance and keep our students safe, we will still have our weekday school Mass as last year, one on Wednesday and the other on Thursday, These Masses on those days will be at 8:30 a.m. to accommodate our students. There will be NO 8:00 a.m. Mass on Thursday during the school year. Instead, on Wednesday and Thursday, our Mass time will start at 8:30 a.m. However, the Mass times on Monday, Tuesday, Friday, and Saturday will remain at 8:00 a.m.

This Sunday, August 15th, we will have an outdoor Mass at 4:00 p.m. for the opening of our new school year at St. Peter School. Parents and students are invited to attend and asked to bring their own chairs and/or blankets to sit upon. After the Mass, then the students and parents will be able to go into their classrooms and meet their teachers. Of course the outside Mass is weather permitting.

For those who might be interested, I have started having Mass at QND on Tuesdays and Thursdays during the school year at 7:00 a.m. in the chapel. Any parishioners interested in celebrating with us at that hour is welcome to attend.

Finally, my last comment concerns the latest governor's executive order requiring masks being worn in our public and private grade schools. Whatever one might think of this order, whether lawful or not, whether infringing on our rights or not, we are mandated to follow it. If we don't there are consequences and I can only imagine that these consequences will affect our schools. These consequences have to do with accreditation, our lunch programs, any grant or title programs we now have, as well as our athletic programs. Yes, these possible consequences could hurt us badly and I am not sure we are ready to do battle in a court of law if we were to lose. And so far, this governor has the courts on his side. Let's just hope that the power of prayer will change this situation.


