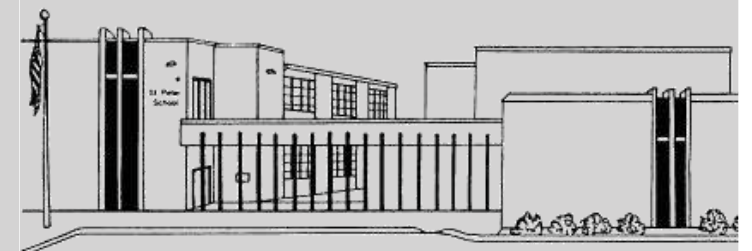
Adoration Chapel Update

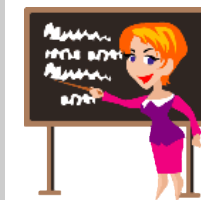
CURRICULUM NIGHT AT ST. PETER SCHOOL FOR GRADES 1-8 – Aug. 31st

Last week, I received a call from Fr. Delix Michel, the pastor of the parishes for our sister parishes in Haiti. He informed me that the earthquake did not affect his parishes but it had devastating effects upon other parts of the island. Besides this natural disaster, the people then had two hurricanes that hit the island that did affect his parishes. What they are needing is food. Our Haiti committee is organizing people to begin creating rice bags to be sent to Haiti. As a parish we will support this effort which should be around \$1200. This project will benefit those who are really hurting and need the healing touch of Jesus through our love and support for them. I also ask that you pray for each of them. I am convinced that prayer is perhaps the only thing that keeps people going with the crosses and struggles that they encounter.
