
Dear Parishioners,

I think one of the most moving statements applied to Jesus is the one we find in our first reading from the prophet Isaiah. During the stations of the cross, I think it was the 12th station we read, "I gave my back to those who beat me, my cheeks to those who plucked my beard; my face I did not shield from buffets and spitting." Although these words are from Isaiah, yet the image can be seen in Jesus and His suffering and death on the cross. And why? Perhaps the answer is found in the love that Jesus had for us in becoming one of us to save us from ourselves and the depravity that sin has caused for all of us. Because of that love, Jesus would take upon Himself the sins of humankind and would nail them to the cross. In spite of being rejected, beat, spat upon, Jesus never gave up on us and the offering of His life was accepted in the resurrection. Now just when we thank God for this gift of redemption in Jesus, this same Jesus offers us an opportunity to unite with His cross. We do so when we offer up the crosses of our lives, and walk with Him, knowing that He is with us. And this Jesus says to us today in our gospel, "whoever wishes to come after me must deny him/herself, take up his/her cross, and follow me." It is only by giving our life to Jesus that we will find true life and be saved.


Just a reminder that next week, from Monday night, Sept. 20th, to Thursday noon, Sept. 23rd, the priests of the diocese will be attending their annual convocation. This year the convocation will be in Collinsville, Illinois. Since we will be away from the parish on those days, we will not be having daily Mass on Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday, Sept. 21st, 22nd, and 23rd. Instead of daily Mass, Deacon Bob Lundberg has graciously offered to do a Communion Service on those days that we will be away. There will be NO Masses at QND on that Tuesday and Thursday. As we are away from the parish, I ask for your prayers.

With humility and with much gratitude, I want to share with you that I have been honored to receive the "Friend of Children Award" given to me by our neighbors, Chaddock and the Chaddock Children's Foundation. I was privileged to spend six years as a member of their Advisory Board, listening to all that they do for young people. In my capacity as a member of the Board, I have grown to appreciate what they continually do for what I call the "anawim." This is a Hebrew term often used for those who seem to be forgotten by society. They were often the widows and orphans, and any others who fell into a category of the forgotten. In the beatitudes, they are called the "poor in spirit." What Chaddock provides for these often forgotten young people is a school and a setting that believes in them, helps them to find themselves, challenges them, and then reconciles them to society and their families. It is tremendous work and Chaddock, and their services rendered, is what I often call the best kept secret that Ouincy has to offer. Chaddock is also very well known on the national level for their work with children. Their mission statement says it all: "our efforts are grounded in a shared vision—a world where every person matters, relationships are valued and healing and change are possible—and shared values of Faith, Relationships, Learning and Caring." What a joy to have Chaddock as our neighbor and friend for all these years.


