Twenty-sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time, September 26, 2021

Dear Parishioners,

As we celebrate this last weekend in our month of September, I can't believe that this month is finally coming to an end. It is hard to believe that October is just around the corner. For some reason, September just seemed to be a long month. Maybe it was filled with a lot of activity, or perhaps with the start of school in late August, it just seemed so long. And this past Wednesday, September 22nd, we celebrate the Autumn equinox thus beginning a new season of the year. Hopefully the weather will change to be more in line with this season of the year and we will begin to see the beauties of creation as God transforms His creation in preparation for winter.

In our gospel today, the disciples are faced with a dilemma. Someone who is not within their number casting out devils, using Jesus' name. They didn't quite understand this dilemma and perhaps expected God only to be present in and through them. Sometimes as human beings, we like to picture God working in only the way that we want or desire. We like to keep God in a box and exclusive only to us. But God doesn't operate according to the thoughts of His creation. Instead God will be God and will do what He wants regardless of what we might think. So in response to this dilemma, Jesus tells His disciples, "do not prevent him. There is no one who performs a mighty deed in my name who can at the same time speak ill of me." In other words, Jesus challenges His disciples not to try to control God but let God be God. And that's the attitude that we are to have as we see God's handiwork working in and through many differing people. One doesn't have to be a Catholic to experience His miracles; one doesn't have to be a part of our Church to have prayers answered. As Jesus nudged His disciples, so He nudges us to see God in a broader perspective and not exclusive to only ourselves.

Once again we will be having our annual Leadership Retreat next Saturday, October 2nd, from 8:00 a.m. (opening Mass in Church) to about 2:00 p.m. This day will be led by Msgr. Robert Tucker, from the diocese of Lincoln, Nebraska. The title of the day will be St. Joseph, the Good Steward. This annual event is a gift to the ministry leaders and assists parishioners to discern how God is calling you to use your gifts for His people, right here and right now. We ask that you position yourselves two arm's lengths apart along the South Side of Broadway between 14th and 18th Streets. Do not stand in groups. Bring a lawn chair only if unable to stand. This event is an opportunity to stand for life and is held in more than 1,400 cities in the United States.

Please remember this is an hour of silent prayer. For 34 years, pro-life Christians across the United States and Canada have publicly, prayerfully, and peacefully stood in prayer and repentance on behalf of legalized abortion each fall.




Parish Retreat - ST. JOSEPH - THE GOOD STEWARD
