

STUDENTS ARE LOVING OUR NEW STEM LAB





As most of you are aware, Haiti has been struggling with many differing issues. First, their poverty, then the assassination of their president, then to compound things even further, they were hit by an earthquake and then two differing hurricanes. To say that they have had their crosses is an understatement. In light of this we have joined with the Parish Twinning programs to help with some relief. Our parish, including our junior high, packed some food bags that will be delivered to the areas most in need. We contributed the monies to buy the food, our parish along with QU provided volunteers to pack these bags, and then they were delivered to St. Francis Motherhouse in Springfield for shipment by boat. I want to thank our Haiti committee for organizing this food relief, for our junior high for assisting, and for all of our volunteers to help with this food relief. I'm very proud of the efforts that fulfill the words of Jesus, "whatsoever you do to the least of our brothers and sisters you do for me."
