### Dear Parishioners,

This weekend, we celebrate the 33rd Sunday in Ordinary time. For liturgical reasons, with this celebration, we are celebrating the last Sunday numbered as “ordinary.” Next weekend, even though it concludes “ordinary time” we celebrate a Solemnity, namely, the Solemnity of Christ the King. Then the weekend after we begin the new liturgical year with the celebration of the First Sunday of Advent.

As the Church celebrates the conclusion of this time called “ordinary,” it wants to draw our attention that we always need to prepare for the end of time. We never know the hour nor the day, but so often our end, namely death, comes to us “like a thief in the night.” So our lives must always be prepared as we live in this transitory world only to have our eyes fixed on that permanent dwelling, life with our God in heaven. Let each of us be prepared to meet the Lord no matter when He returns for us.
