Our Lord Jesus Christ, Kind of the Universe Solemnity, November 21, 2021

Dear Parishioners,

The Church concludes it's liturgical year with the celebration of the Solemnity of Christ, the King. This Solemnity is placed at the end of the Church's year to offer us a clear statement of our belief that Christ is both the beginning and the end of time, the alpha and omega. All things flow to and from Him. The kingdom of the Lord is the only lasting kingdom and we and all our world will be someday brought under its sway. At least that was the hope of Christ and is the hope of the Church.

Our gospel for this Solemnity has Jesus being brought before Pilate, the representative of political authority and power in Jerusalem. The first question Pilate asks is the question, "are you the King of the Jews?" Jesus plays along with the questioning and poses a question in return, "do you say this on your own or have others told you about me?" Then Pilate retorts that he wasn't a Jew and that the Jewish people have handed Jesus over to him for a ruling. Jesus in His Wisdom basically tells Pilate that "my kingdom does not belong to this world. If my kingdom did belong to this world, my attendants would be fighting to keep me from being handed over to the Jews. But as it is, my kingdom is not here." What Jesus is fundamentally saying is that His kingdom is drastically different than the ones experienced in history. Those kingdoms used power and coercion to oppress people, they used force and military to keep people in line, and they built kingdoms to suppress and maintain their stature in the community. Jesus' kingdom, however, is so beautifully reflected in the Preface of the Mass today for it says poetically that Jesus "wants to make all created things subject to His rule, that He might present to the immensity of the majesty of God, an eternal and universal kingdom, a kingdom of truth and life, a kingdom of holiness and grace, a kingdom of justice, love, and peace." Do we find that kingdom existing today? Only in our hope and dreams. Let's pray those words of the Our Father and truly mean them, "for thy kingdom come, thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven." Only then will His kingdom take root in our hearts and lives and Jesus will be our universal King.

This Thursday, November 25th is Thanksgiving Day. We will gather to thank God for His blessings at 9:30 a.m. Come and join us.

As my Advent gift to our parishioners, I am giving you the book titled ADVENT, GOSPEL REFLECTIONS, by Bishop Robert Barron. Please take one per family and use it during this season of Advent as a means of growing in God's grace and preparing your lives for the Christmas mystery. Please use it each day, reflecting upon the questions presented, and then journal your journey within the book. Happy Advent.

Just a reminder that we will be celebrating the Sacrament of Confirmation on the 2nd, 3rd, and 4th Sundays of Advent for our 6th, 7th, and 8th graders. This will be at a special Sunday Mass at 1:00 p.m. Before I am asked, yes, this does fulfill the Sunday obligation. Also during those celebrations some of our 3rd graders will be celebrating not only Confirmation but also their First Holy Communion. I ask our parish family to keep these young people in your prayers.




