# The Parish of St. Peter Quincy, IL

First Sunday of Advent, November 28, 2021

### **Dear Parishioners.**

With this First Sunday of Advent, the Church begins a new liturgical year. That means we are in the cycle C in our readings for the weekend and year II in our weekday readings. The emphasis this year is on the gospel of St. Luke. As we celebrate this time before Christmas called ADVENT. I am asking 1. Wednesday 8:30 a.m. you to put yourselves into the spirit of this season. It is not just time before Christmas for shopping and parties, but rather it is a special time to open up our hearts and our lives for Jesus' coming. As anticipation for this Christmas, I ask you to do some special things to help you get ready. Perhaps we might get our nativity set out and put our figures into it one for each day. And even more important, maybe get some straw and for every act of charity done, we place it in the manger. And perhaps we can get our Advent wreath set up and light a candle with a praver each day. Whatever practice you choose, let's make sure that Advent truly finds our hearts ready and well prepared for Jesus' coming that First Christmas as well as His final coming whenever that day happens.

> If you choose to use the Advent wreath, I am presenting you with a blessing from the Church upon the wreath and all who use it. You are asked to read the prophet Isaiah, chapter 9, verses 1-2, and 5-6. Then the blessing:

Lord God, your Church joyfully awaits the coming of its

Savior, who enlightens our hearts and dispels the darkness

of ignorance and sin. Pour forth your blessings upon us

as we light the candles of this wreath; may their light

reflect the splendor of Christ, who is Lord, for ever and ever.

For those who notice I will be in a sling and a brace on my wrist and a splint on my finger for the next few weeks. Unfortunately, I took a spill outside a home and ended up with a few fractures, thus, the reason for the sling and braces. Keep me in your prayers.

Wednesday, December 8th, is a Holyday of Obligation in our Church. The Mass schedule is as follows:

December 7th, Vigil Mass at 6:00 p.m.

December 8th, Solemnity Masses at 8:30 a.m., 10:00 a.m. at QND, 12:10 p.m., and 6:30 p.m.

This weekend in the narthex of the Church, we will have available the giving wreath tags. This is a concrete example of stewardship in practice. As you know, there are some in our community not as blessed as we are for a variety of reasons. Without judging or condemning, we are able to see members of God's kingdom who are lacking in so many things. As a way to put a smile on their faces this Christmas, I ask you to take a tag, make a purchase that is written on the tag, wrap the present and then bring it back to Church on the weekend of December 11-12th. Through this program we can share God's blessings with those who are in need and thus begin to fulfill our role in God's kingdom here on earth. Thank you for sharing your blessings and gifts with others.


### **DEDICATION & BLESSING OF FR. TOLTON STATUE AND PLAOUES**
