Thirty-second Sunday in Ordinary Time, November 7, 2021


Dear Parishioners,

On this first weekend in November, the Church celebrates the 32nd Sunday in Ordinary Time. Considering that there are only 34 Sundays in this time that we call "ordinary" the Church is bringing its liturgical calendar to a close. In other words, there are only two weekends left before we begin a new liturgical calendar with the beginning of Advent on November 27-28th.

I was thinking to myself that the readings for this weekend fit perfectly into our annual parish stewardship renewal. Our first reading is from the Book of Kings and is the story of the widow of Zarephath. As the story goes, Elijah the prophet encounters a widow during a three-year drought which affected the people. The widow believes that she is at the end of her struggles, having but a bit of food before her son and herself face starvation. At the word of the prophet, she shares with Elijah what she has remaining. In the midst of such generosity, Elijah reassures her that "the jar of flour shall not go empty, nor the jug of oil run dry until the day when the Lord sends rain upon the earth." These words ring true as our reading tells us that she was able to eat for a year, she and her son. This story is a beautiful illustration of stewardship. God has given so much to all of us, and in return with thankful hearts we return to Him a portion or a tithe of what we receive. And to no one's surprise who practice stewardship, human kind will never be able to out give our God in generosity. From time, talents, and treasures,-all treasures and gifts from God, when we return a portion of what we have received, we will always experience more time, more talents, and more treasures coming our way in so many differing ways. What we return to a God who is so generous, we will find that our jar of flour will never go empty nor the jugs of oil in our lives ever run dry. Do you believe this? I do and my life bears witness to it.

Our gospel for this weekend follows the same pattern of stewardship. Jesus is in the Temple and notices a woman of very poor means, a widow, who puts in two small coins into the treasury. And what Jesus sees is the generosity of a woman who had very little, and yet seems to give from her poverty, her own livelihood. Unlike others who gave from their surplus, when we begin to give from our livelihoods Jesus does take notice. And it is in that generosity that God's generosity will continue to be reflected whether we give of our time, talents, or treasures. As we bring this annual parish stewardship renewal to a close, I am still asking you to take your renewal forms to prayer, and then to fill them out with the same generosity as the widows in our reading for when we do it is then that we discover God's generosity toward each of us. Thank you again for your stewardship in our parish family.

Next Wednesday, November 10th, we will have the dedication and blessing of our Fr. Tolton garden as well as the plaques on the wall depicting so much of his life. The blessing and dedication will take place after the 8:30 a.m. Mass. Hopefully the weather will cooperate and we will be able to have this celebration outdoors. November 10th is a special day in his life as it was the death date of his mother, Martha Jane Tolton. We ask special prayers from both Martha and Venerable Augustine as we dedicate this area and these plaques to our favorite son of the parish and his mother.





As we moved the statue of Venerable Augustine Tolton, there was a void in front of St. Peter School. It is amazing how God works. In its place, we have another statue with much significance to the Quincy community, a statue of St. Vincent De Paul. In a plaque to be later mounted, we find the following inscribed: "The statue of St. Vincent De Paul was originally erected in 1884 atop the St. Vincent's Home for the Aged in Quincy, Illinois. Before the building was destroyed in 1992, the statue was saved and transferred to the new facility, St. Vincent's Home by Wayne and Dorothy Messick. This statue was donated to St. Peter Parish by their descendants the Reis and Gray families on October 1, 2021." On behalf of our parish family we are very grateful for this donation of this statue which is a piece of the history of our community.
