Thirty-first Sunday in Ordinary Time, October 31, 2021

Dear Parishioners,

As we celebrate the last weekend in our month of October, the Church is bringing its liturgical season to a close. As it does, it challenges us to reflect upon some important questions in our lives. The first question is raised by one of the scribes who asks Jesus, “Which is the first of all the commandments?” Jesus in His wisdom replies what every Jewish person of His time period understood, an that is “to love the Lord God with all our hearts, with all our souls, with all our minds, and with all our strength.” This was nothing new for most Jews as they understood its importance from their Scriptures. But then Jesus adds another commandment, one that He would challenge His disciples to live and that is “to love our neighbor as we love ourselves.” Then Jesus adds, “there are no other commandments greater than these.” As we reflect upon His words this week, how serious do we take these commandments? Just as they were the foundation of His new way of life and living, so they become foundational for us in the way we live our lives. To love our God means that He is the center of our lives, the Being whom we give our time, and hearts to each week in worship. To excuse ourselves from this worship lessens this commandment in importance in our lives each week. And the second commandment, “to love our neighbor as we love ourselves” should also be a foundational stone of our lives and reflected in the respect that we have for others. Let each of us be challenged by the words of Jesus and live, cherish, and promote these foundational stones of all of our lives.

As we begin the month of November, the Church challenges us to remember the proclamation of our faith in the Apostles Creed. It states and we believe in the “Communion of Saints.” What does that mean? It means that when we proclaim this statement, we are proclaiming that we believe in our union with Jesus, and His kingdom. In other words, we are called to be “saints,” a person who is a sinner but nonetheless with God’s grace, tries to live those two great commandments of love. This is our calling, this is our vocation—to be saints, united with God both here on earth and in heaven. The saints in heaven are what we call the “Church triumphant.” Some are canonized, the majority are not. But they have reached their final goal and their feast is this Monday, November 1st, the Solemnity of All Saints. Then we have the Church militant, those consist of you and me as we still struggle here on earth to follow Jesus. Then we have what is termed the Church suffering, those are the “souls in purgatory” who through God’s mercy are making their lives ready for the triumphal entry into heaven. Their feast is All Soul’s Day, November 2nd. During this month of November, let’s remember all those who have died and pray for the repose of their souls so that they might have eternal life.

Because November 1st falls on a Monday, it is not a obligatory holyday. Nevertheless, we will have an 8:30 a.m., 10:00 a.m. (QND), 12:10 p.m. and a 6:30 p.m. Masses. Come celebrate with us.

Since we are remembering those in our parish who died this past year, our Mass of remembrance will be next Saturday, Nov. 6th, at 5:00 p.m. The Book of the Dead will also be near the baptismal font for any names to be written of family and friends who died this past year. We will remember them at each Mass.
