**Dear Parishioners,**

This weekend we gathered together to celebrate the 3rd Sunday in our season of Advent. The third Sunday of Advent is traditionally called Gaudete Sunday. The word Gaudete translates the Latin word which means to rejoice. Gathering together more than halfway through Advent the church invites us to look forward with joy at the coming of our savior. The whole concept of rejoicing is present in our readings for this Sunday. Our first reading from Zephaniah begins by stating “Shout for joy, O daughter Zion! Sing joyfully, O Israel! Be glad and exult with all your heart, O daughter Jerusalem!” The reason Zephaniah could say this is found also in this reading where it says “The Lord, your God, is in your midst, a mighty savior.” Then we hear Saint Paul telling the Philippians in our second reading as it says “Rejoice in the Lord always. I shall say it again: rejoice! The Lord is near.” Thus we find in these readings the cause of our joy, the reason for us to rejoice, because the Lord is near. So on this third Sunday of Advent there truly is a cause for joy as we recognize that the coming of our Lord and savior is near in hand.

Last Sunday we had a beautiful celebration of the First Communion for many of our third graders and the celebration of Confirmation for these same third graders as well as some of our older grade school students. It was a great delight for me to celebrate the sacraments with them and I was so proud of them as the grace of God entered into their lives in what I would call this grace moment. This Sunday we will celebrate the same sacraments again for some of our third graders as they receive the First Communion and celebrate the sacrament of Confirmation along with some of our other older students. Please keep them in your prayers as the gift of the Holy Spirit fills their lives and the gift of the Eucharist strengthens their hearts to be witnesses for the gospel.

This weekend we are making available to you our 2022 parish calendars. They will be in the narthex of the church and I asked you to please pick them up after the Masses this weekend. These are available to us with the compliments of Duker and Haugh Funeral Home. I also ask you to take an extra calendar for any of our parishioners who might be in a nursing home or confined in their homes. Let's show our care for them and our concern for them and our desire that they have a sense of belonging to our church by distributing our parish calendars to them. Thank you for doing this.

As we look forward to Christmas, I want to once again publish our Christmas schedule. On December 24th, Christmas Eve, Masses will be at 4:00 p.m., 6:00 p.m. and 8:00 p.m. On Christmas Day, December 25th, our Masses will be at 8:00 a.m. and 10:00 a.m. \*\* Because the 4:00 p.m. Mass on Christmas Eve is so crowded, I am asking some of our parishioners to consider another Mass for that evening. I know that this is asking a lot but in order to accommodate the crowds I'm asking you to consider this. It would be very nice to be able to seat everyone for this celebration but, in reality, so many come and will find themselves standing through most of the Mass.

 The Knights of Columbus will be holding a special Christmas Eve TV Mass on December 24th at 4:00pm. It will be held on channel 3 (ABC).


