Dear Parishioners,

This weekend the church celebrates the second Sunday in our season of Advent. In our gospel reading today St. Luke presents to us one of our Advent figures, namely John the Baptist. In this reading Luke presents John the Baptist as a historical figure and does so in such a way that he places John in a historical context. As other writers of his day, Luke indicates a specific time in which John is present, “in the fifteenth year of the reign of Tiberius Caesar,” then Luke continues to describe that period of time giving his names as Pontius Pilate, the governor Herod and his brother Philip who were the tetrarchs of EU regions and then finally including the two high priests, Annas and Caiaphas. Luke seems to want to inform his readers the John was an actual historical figure somehow preparing the people for a very special coming. Perhaps a summation of Luke's testimony is the fact that he sees John as the prophet Isaiah quoting that same prophet as “voice of one crying out in the desert: prepare the way of the Lord, make straight his paths.” Thus on the second Sunday of Advent the church introduces all of us to that Advent figure, John the Baptist, who would bridge the Old Testament and the New Testament together. Perhaps it might be wise for us to look into our own lives to try our best to live the words of the prophet Isaiah. The prophet who tells us that we are to prepare the way of the Lord in our own lives, that we are to make straight his paths, filling in the valleys of despair and vulnerability in our lives and bringing down the mountains of pride, greed, and lack of forgiveness. Let each of us use this time of Advent to grow ever closer to the God who wants to share our life with us.

Just a reminder that this Wednesday, December 8th, is a holy day of obligation. We will have a vigil Mass for this holy day on Tuesday, December 7th, at 6:00 p.m. The Masses for the holy day will be as follows; 8:30 a.m., our all school Mass, 10:00 a.m. at Quincy Notre Dame High School, 12:10 p.m. at Saint Peter church, and a 6:30 p.m. Mass. This holy day is very special for us here in the United States as it celebrates the patroness of our country namely Mary, under the title of the Immaculate Conception. This holy day is also special to us as the Diocese of Springfield, IL for we also have Mary as our patron under the title of the Immaculate Conception. So I encourage you to come and celebrate with us this very special day in the life of our country and in the life of our diocese.

This Sunday, December 5th, we will be celebrating the sacrament of Confirmation as well as the sacrament of First Communion for many of our students in our parish. The Bishop has given me the privilege of celebrating this sacrament for our students so that we can get caught up with the celebration of all of our sacraments. I ask your special prayers for not only those students who will be confirmed but also for those students who will be receiving their first communion. As we celebrate the sacraments I want to especially thank our parents, our teachers, our sponsors and this entire parish for their prayers, love and support. A special thank you to Gina Bergman, our Director of Religious Education, who has done so much to get our young people ready for this special day. Even though we will be celebrating all the sacraments of initiation, this doesn't mean that our education in the faith and the continual celebration of the sacraments comes to an

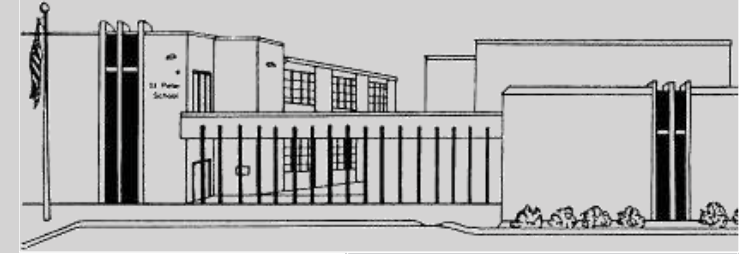
Adoration Chapel

My Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Pope Francis often highlights the role older adults play in conveying faith from one generation to the next. Recently, he noted that "there is no retirement age from the work of proclaiming the Gospel." ¹As we approach the annual Retirement Fund for Religious collection—an appeal that benefits some 26,000 elderly Catholic sisters, brothers, and religious order priests—I am reminded that senior religious never retire from their vows.
