#### Dear Parishioners,

This weekend we celebrate the 6th Sunday in ordinary time. Perhaps the theme of this weekend is found in the beautiful words of our Responsorial Psalm. This response quotes Psalm 1 which states: "Blessed are they who hope in the Lord." This response should be fundamental to our lives of faith for when we believe in our God, we have the hope, the trust that God is in charge and will someday and somehow bring the best out of us and this world.

If we look at the first reading for our Mass, Jeremiah sees a reality that we don't always want to see in life. He tells us that "the one who trusts in human beings, who seeks his strength in flesh, whose heart turns away from the Lord will be cursed." The beautiful image used leaves a lasting impression as it tell us that the person who trusts in the things of this world is like a "barren bush in the desert, or like a person who stands in lava waste." In other words, there is little life, yet alone lasting happiness. But those who trust in the Lord bears fruit through all differing kinds of changes in the seasons. In other words, those who hope in the things of this world will experience a life without meaning or purpose. If there is any bit of happiness, it is never lasting and always will lead to our own destruction. But those who trust in the Lord, will find a sense of purpose, and a sense of meaning in the reality of this world, with a hope for a fullness in the next world. So, "blessed is the one who trusts in the Lord, whose hope is the Lord."

Our gospel for this weekend is from St. Luke and has Jesus presenting the four beatitudes and four woes. The four beatitudes reflect those disciples who trust in the Lord. Their lives are lived contrary to the things of this world. These include the poor, the hungry, those who weep and those who are rejected and ridiculed because of their commitment to Jesus. To these disciples who do not allow the deception of the things of this world to interfere in their lives of faith, Jesus says that they will be "blessed." And "blessed" means happiness and joy, being richly blessed with a sight that is far beyond this world and yet a part of this world. There is depth, there is joy, there is happiness. As Jesus concluded His proclamation of those who are blessed He states: "rejoice and leap for joy for your reward will be great in heaven."

The last verses of this gospel are the woes, directed at those who trust in the things of this world. They might be rich, and full, and laugh, and people might sings our praises—these won't last and we will experience what it means to be unhappy and without meaning.

Next weekend we were supposed to have another collection for our sister parishes in Haiti. This collection was for underwear and socks. We have to put this collection on hold since we received news from the parish twinning program, which transports all of our items to Haiti, that all shipments to Haiti have been postponed. We will continue to store what we received two weeks ago but we will not be collecting any further items until we hear from our people who ship the containers. This is very disappointing but understandable considering the current unrest in Haiti. In the meantime, please pray for our sister parishes.

There will be NO COLLECTION OF UNDERWEAR AND SOCKS the weekend of Feb. 19-20. The committee just received a letter from the Parish Twinning Program of the Americas (PTPA) that the Spring 2022 Sea Container Program has been postponed until, hopefully, Fall 2022. Ongoing concerns about the ability to ship items to Haiti safely and logistics issues in Nashville, including warehouse availability, prompted PTPA's decision. Once we have new shipping information, we hope to announce collection dates for underwear and socks. In the meantime, we will store the personal care products that were gathered in January.

Obviously, the news from the Parish Twinning Program of the Americas is a disappointment for all of us. Because it occurred during our annual Twinning collection we want to make parishioners aware of what was happening. Thank you for all you do for our Sister Parishes. Please continue to keep them in your pravers.


#### St. Edward's Annual Pork Sales and Breakfast
