#### Dear Parishioners,

We continue our Autumn season, with the days getting shorter, the weather becoming a little more crisp, and nature is turning colors. It is a beautiful time of the year as nature transforms itself, getting ready for the winter months. If there is ever a time to enjoy the picture that God is painting in the Fall, it becomes the present time. Please take time to enjoy.

One of the questions with which many of us continue to deal is the question of eternal life. Yes, we have experienced the death of people in our lives, wondering what lies ahead for all of us. We have been taught about life after death, new life in the midst of the tomb, yet we wonder whether we are worthy of it. It is not a question particularly of this age, but we even find it a part of the question in the time of Jesus. In our gospel, it states that "a man ran up, knelt down before Jesus, and asked, 'Good teacher, what must I do to inherit eternal life?" If that sounds familiar, it is a question that sometimes we all ask as we confront the reality of death in our lives. Jesus states the obvious, about keeping the commandments. The man, very proud of his behavior, states that he has observed them from his youth. "Jesus looked at him, loved him, and said to him, 'you are lacking in one thing. Go, sell what you have, and give to the poor and you will have treasure in heaven; then come follow me." This invitation is open to each one of us. Jesus looks at us, loves us, and then challenges us to let go of the allurements of the earth and follow Him. Whether as married people, as ordained clergy, or as single persons, Jesus wants us to make Him a priority in life, and in so doing, find our treasure in heaven. When we speak of stewardship, this is what this word means for us. Making Christ our priority, and giving Him our time, talents, and treasures. And when we do, then we find the greatest treasure we will ever have, a relationship with the one who loves us and who shares His life both here on earth as it is in heaven. May each of you respond to Jesus' invitation with open hearts and outstretched arms.

Next Saturday night at the 5:00 p.m. Mass, we welcome the students of Quincy Notre Dame to our Mass before their homecoming festivities. What a great tradition to have them present, celebrating the Eucharist together before an evening filled with many memories.

During the month of October, you will notice that our ushers will be going up and down the aisle during a part of the Mass and counting people. This is to fulfill our annual October count required by the diocese. Each year during October, we have to send the diocesan officials the number of people in the pews. The count is noted and saved for future comparisons.

October is the month of the rosary as well as the month of respect for life. I ask you to pray the rosary once a week asking God to help our country restore a respect for all life. Unfortunately in the age of COVID, we have lost a respect for life: we have instead let anger and a lack of civility be present in our speech, emails, and texts to such a degree that we have lost a respect for life other than our own. What a sad commentary!
