## Dear Parishioners,

This weekend we celebrate the 29th Sunday in this Ordinary time. We have only five weekends left before we enter the season of Advent. This is hard to believe but our calendar speaks for itself.

As we close out this season, we hear from a cast of characters who ask Jesus a variety of questions. These are the same questions that sometimes we ponder and reflect upon. Last week, the young man asked, "what must I do to enter eternal life?" A legitimate question and it seems to reflect upon us even more so as we age more and more. Today's question involves the sons of Zebedee who asked Jesus to do for them whatever they ask of Jesus. This is sort of an open ended question but it is a question that I know that I have asked of Jesus in my life. Jesus, do this for me, or do that for me. Whether it is in prayer or just some type of reflection, yes, we want Jesus to do for us whatever we might ask. For these sons of Zebedee, they envisioned Jesus as He brings forth His kingdom and they wanted to have an important position in that kingdom, namely, to sit at His right and His left in that kingdom to come. With that question, now we find Jesus in His teaching position. He points out positions in the kingdom is not for Him to assign. Then He tells them 'whoever wishes to be great among you will be your servant; whoever wishes to be first among you will be the slave of all. For the Son of Man did not come to be served but to serve and give His life as a ransom for many." Jesus turns the world of the sons of Zebedee completely upside down. A simple question forced them to realize a total transformation in their thinking about importance and the kingdom of God. The same teaching also applies to us two thousand years later.

We want to welcome our students from QND who are present with us to celebrate this Saturday evening Mass as they get ready for their annual homecoming dance. I pray that God keeps them all safe and that His Spirit is given to them to help them make wise and prudent choices. May God watch over them and keep them from all harm.

As we look ahead, I ask you to reserve Wednesday, November 10th, in your calendars. November 10th is the anniversary of the death of Martha Jane Tolton, the mother of Venerable Augustus Tolton. Because this is her anniversary, I thought there would be no greater day to bless our Tolton statue and new garden and then to bless and dedicate our plaques in his honor. And so after our 8:30 a.m. Mass, I will invite our grade school students along with any and all parishioners to come out and celebrate this special day. As we remember Martha Jane, so we remember her son Augustus and ask God for that miracle needed to move this canonization process forward. So come and join us for this blessing and dedication. Again, it will be after the 8:30 a.m. Mass on Wednesday, November 10th. In case of rain and inclement weather, we will postpone it for another time.

Our Mass of Remembrance for those parishioners who have died this past year will be on Saturday, November 6th, at the 5:00 p.m. Mass. This will include all those parishioners who died this past year. May they rest in peace.

## Blessed Sacrament - Theology on Tap





Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

**World Mission Sunday** - the annual, worldwide Eucharistic celebration for the Missions of the Church - will be on **October 24** this year.
