Dear Parishioners,


Well the month of July has come to an end. I know this saddens me as I realize that summer vacation is coming to a close and school will be starting in just over two weeks. All the plans that I made or hoped to accomplish are now just memories of things left undone. But time goes on as we enjoy these last few weeks.

One of the realities that we all have to face is the reality of our own mortality. That means that death is inevitable. So often we are confronted with this reality in the death of someone very close to us. Needless to say, death often hits home and when it does, it becomes an experience that brings sorrow and sadness and an experience for which we dread. I can remember when my parents died, my mom first, and then my dad several years later. They were always the rock of my life and I knew that they would always be there for me. So much for the role of parents of a priest. And when they died, I realized a reality that was made present to me, that they would no longer be there as that rock. With God's grace I then began to realize that God had been that rock, although His steadfastness was made present in their lives for me. I also realized that life does go on, that I've been blessed with siblings and a parish family to be now my main support and rock. Such the experience of death would not disable me, but would help me to experience a strength that had always been present and a strength that would continue through the lives and love of family, of friends, and of my parish. Yes, death can be tragic and does change us all. But for us who have a faith and a hope, death is part of our journey and Jesus has the final say in our journey, claiming the hope of something far greater that we call life with Him. And for that life to be a reality, we hear Paul in his letter to the Colossians state: "If you were raised with Christ, seek what is above, where Christ is seated at the right hand of God. Think of what is above, not of what is on earth." In the midst of this experience of death, our thoughts truly do turn to what is above for that is our very life and hope.

Last Saturday, July 23rd, one of our parishioners, Connie Schrage, received the "Women of Distinction Award" sponsored by the Springfield in Illinois Diocesan Council of Catholic Women. She was nominated by me as a representative from St. Peter to receive that award for her service to God, Parish, and Community. For years, Connie has been the coordinator of our RCIA process, as well as one of our ladies who has done the Church linen for years. She received this award at a Mass and Luncheon in Springfield with the Bishop presenting the awards for the women who were nominated by their pastors for the parishes throughout the diocese. Congratulations, Connie, we are proud of you! Thank you for sharing your gifts of time and talents with us.

Our Totus Tuus program recently came to an end on Friday. I hope and pray that our young people were touched by the leaders present and grew in their faith and devotion to God and the Church. We had about 150 total number of kids with about 110 in the daytime program and 40 in our evening program. I want to thank St. Francis Parish for sponsoring this summer program along with St. Peter Parish.


