Twenty-second Sunday in Ordinary Time, August 28, 2022

Dear Parishioners,

On this last weekend in our month of August, the Church celebrates the 22nd Sunday in Ordinary Time. It's interesting on this particular weekend that the gospel is a parable told by Jesus of those people who are invited to a wedding banquet. The gist of the parable is that when invited, we are not to think of ourselves as most important, taking a place of honor at the table. Instead, "when you are invited, go and take the lowest place so that when the host comes to you he may say, "my friend, move up to a higher position. For everyone who exalts himself will be humbled but the one who humbles himself will be exalted." This weekend, we are not celebrating a wedding banquet, but we are celebrating our annual parish picnic. With this celebration, we invite everyone to enjoy a fine meal, liquid nourishment, and a lot of music, fun and games. 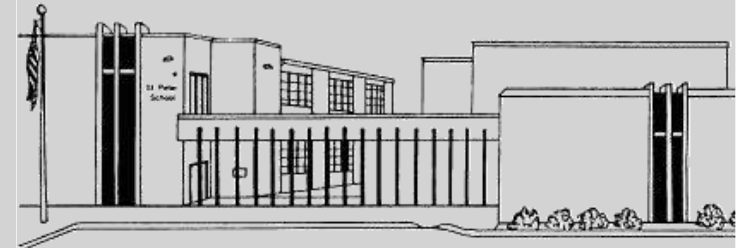
Cost of the weekend is \$165.00 with lodging and all meals provided. A partial monetary gift to defray the cost is available if needed.
