Third Sunday of Advent, December 11, 2022

Dear Parishioners,

Today is called "Gaudete Sunday." The word "Gaudete" is the Latin word which means "Rejoice." It comes from the old Entrance Antiphon for this Sunday which proclaims, "Rejoice in the Lord always, again, I say rejoice. Indeed, the Lord is near." On this third Sunday of Advent we truly look forward and realize that the Lord is near as we prepare ourselves for His coming in our history. And a reflection of that attitude to rejoice, the Church invites the priest and deacons to wear "rose" colored vestments. We are called to be a people of joy in the midst of an imperfect world. We cannot just sit back and wallow in self pity because we live in this imperfect world. Instead, we are called to be a people of faith and hope, to proclaim the good news that Jesus has come, and that Jesus will come again, and always be challenged to live in this positive manner. So, "rejoice," for the Lord is near.

We have our new 2023 St. Peter's Church Catholic calendars available in the narthex of the Church. Besides the necessary information regarding staff, school and rectory numbers, and our Mass times, there are some beautiful religious art pictures in each month of this calendar.
