Fourth Sunday of Advent, December 18, 2022

Dear Parishioners,

This Sunday we light the fourth and final candle in our Advent wreath. This fourth candle indicates to us that this season of preparation is coming to an end. What we have awaited we celebrate in history, the birth of the Messiah and His coming into our world to save us from ourselves and to lead us back to the Father. May this final week of preparation for this historical moment draw us ever closer to our Lord who comes to us in mystery through His Word we preach and His presence we celebrate in our Sacraments.

Our gospel for this weekend introduces us to a man named Joseph. As our Scripture indicates, Joseph was "a righteous man" who was placed in quite a predicament in history. He was betrothed to a young lady whom we can presume that he loved. However, as our gospel tells us, she was found to be with child. And I could only imagine the turmoil he must have felt. He knew this child not to be his, but as this righteous man, "unwilling to expose Mary to shame, decided to divorce her quietly." But as is often the case, God does not abandon His people. In the case of Joseph, in order for His will to be done, sends an angel who appears to Joseph in a dream. And what we find in this man who was righteous, is that he trusted God. Then the final words of our Gospel reflect our salvation history as it states "when Joseph awoke, he did as the angel of the Lord commanded him and took his wife into his home." Joseph trusted because he believed in God's power and God's goodness. He trusted in the words of an angel in a dream and down deep knew that somehow he and Mary were chosen for a special purpose in God's plan of salvation. Uncertain as to what that was, Joseph trusted. What does this say about each of us. We too have a special purpose in God's plan. God continues to speak to us, whether in a dream, or in a thought, or in our own readings— God speaks to us and we, like Joseph, need to trust. And when we do, we will find unveiled for us God's plan for us. So trust, and when doubts arise, trust more.

Next weekend is our celebration of the Solemnity of Christmas. Our Mass schedule is as follows:

Saturday, December 24th, Christmas Eve: Masses will be at 4:00 p.m., 6:00 p.m. and 8:00 p.m. Just to forewarn you, the 4:00 p.m. Mass is extremely crowded and we advise if you can, to choose another to celebrate. People start arriving at 2:00 p.m. and many who show up closer to 4:00 p.m. will find themselves standing in the back.

Sunday, December 25th, Christmas Day: Masses will be at 8:00 and 10:00 a.m.

Second, I want to thank the people on the committee who use their talents to decorate our Church in the Christmas décor. As always, our Church is so beautiful both inside and out. 


