Third Sunday of Lent, March 12, 2023

Dear Parishioners.

Our liturgical calendar indicates that this is the Third Sunday in our Season of Lent. This means we are getting close to the halfway mark in this time of discipline, penance, and prayer. I hope that each of you is making use of this time provided to grow in your relationship with God and His Church. Today in our gospel we have presented to us a conversion story of a woman for whom Jesus touched with His presence and forgiveness. In this story, we find a woman of Samaria going to the well to draw water from it and she meets this man named Jesus. Her first mistake was to begin a conversation with this strange man who asks for her to give Him a drink of water. From then on, Jesus draws her into a deeper conversation about the water that He provides, "the water that quenches the thirst of all." Not quite understanding, she asks to drink of that water. Then Jesus tells her to call her husband and return. Then the conversation centers upon her past life which Jesus reveals to her and then He invites her to a conversion of heart. She begins to understand that perhaps Jesus is the long awaited Messiah. Feeling a remarkable change in her heart and life, she follows Jesus' lead and begins to proclaim what happened to her with all her citizens in Samaria. So much so that we hear John state in this gospel: "Many of the Samaritans of the town began to believe because of the woman who testified, 'He told me everything that I have done." But later after listening to Jesus, John states: "We no longer believe because of the woman's word; for we have heard for ourselves, and we know that this is truly the Savior of the world." This gospel passage is a conversion story as well as a reminder to all of us who are already converted, that Jesus is that Savior who forgives, who reconciles, and who heals. May each of us renew our commitment and our hearts to this person who has touched our lives in so many ways.

Today at our 9:30 a.m. Mass on Sunday, we will have our First Scrutiny for the Elect (catechumens). A scrutiny used to be a test given to those who were longing for baptism. Nowadays, it is a series of prayers and intercessions for these people. Let each of us continue to support our Elect with our prayers, love, and support as they make their final preparations to join us at the Easter Vigil.

This Tuesday and Wednesday March 14-15th, the priests of the diocese are expected to be at a Spring gathering of all the priests to be held in Springfield. Because of this expectation, THERE WILL BE NO TUESDAY EVENING MASS AT 6:30 P.M NOR WILL THERE BE A WEDNESDAY MORNING MASS AT 8:30 A.M. I'm sorry for this inconvenience but...it is expected of us.

I also want to share with you that I had a very uplifting experience on TEC this past weekend. I want to thank Lyn and Mark Strieker for their invitation to be the spiritual director and publicly state what a great job that they did as Lay Directors. I am most thankful to God for His presence on the weekend and for filling all of us, team and candidates, with His graces. And I thank all of you for your love and support, especially with your prayers.

Next weekend, March 17-19th, Fr. Delix Michel from our sister parishes in Haiti will be here with us for a visit. As always please welcome him with our usual warmth and support.


Another opportunity to show your commitment to QND!
