Dear Parishioners,

As we gather on this second weekend in our month of May, we also recognize our Mothers as we celebrate a special day in which we honor and thank them for their role in our lives. There was a country song written by the gospel singer, Shirley Caesar, which was called "No Charge" that I would like to share with you this weekend. It goes like this:

Our little boy came up to his mother in the kitchen one evening while she was fixing supper, and he handed her a piece of paper that he had been writing on. After his mom dried her hands on an apron, she read it and this is what it said:

For cutting the grass, \$10.00; For cleaning my room this week, \$5.00; For going to the store for you, \$5.00; For baby sitting my kid brother for you while you went shopping, \$7.50; For taking out the garbage, \$1.00; For getting a good report card, \$5.00; For cleaning up and raking the yard, \$7,00, total owed: \$40.50.

Well, I'll tell you his mother looked at him standing there expectably, and boy could I see the memories flashing through her mind. So she picked up the pen, turned over the paper he's written on, and this is what she wrote:

For the nine months I carried you while you grew inside of me, No Charge. For all the nights I've sat up with you, doctored and prayed for you, No Charge. For all the trying times, and all the tears you've caused through the years, No Charge. When you add it all up, the cost of my love is, No Charge. For all the nights that were filled with dread, and for the worries I knew were ahead, No Charge. For the toys, food, clothes, and even wiping your nose, there's No Charge, Son. And when you add it all up, the full cost of real love is No Charge.

Well, friends, when our son finished reading what his mother had written, there were great big old tears in his eyes, and he looked straight up at his mother and said, "Mom, I sure do love you." And then he took the pen and in great big letters he wrote, "PAID IN FULL."

On behalf of our parish family, I want to wish all the mothers of our parish a very HAPPY MOTHER'S DAY. Today we recognize you in your special role and we too boldly thank you with our own notes, PAID IN FULL. May God bless you and strengthen each of you for allowing us to see first hand God's unconditional love through your love for each of us.

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ.

This May, our diocese will take up a collection for the Catholic Communication Campaign (CCC). Please prayerfully consider supporting the collection this year. Fifty percent of collected funds stay in the Diocese of Springfield in Illinois and the other 50 percent support communications projects in the United States and around the world. Let me share with you some examples that show the impact of your generosity to the CCC.

Over the past year, our diocese had several big announcements and news stories that were important for the people of our diocese to know. This included the Norbertine Fathers of St. Michael's Abbey opening up the Evermode Institute July 1 of this year, the diocesan Year of the Eucharist going on now, the Eucharistic Congress happening this October, the Illinois March for Life occurring in Springfield for the first time in March, honoring the life and legacy of Pope Benedict XVI after his death, and the countless stories of conversion, inspiration, and faith of people in our diocese.

Through Catholic Times, social media, podcasting, and other digital methods, our diocese is taking advantage of several communication outlets to spread the news of our diocese, teach the faith, and provide hope and encouragement to people no matter where they are in their faith life.

Followers on the diocesan social media channels continue to grow. Our channels have far more followers than most dioceses our size, and several that are two to three times as big as our diocese. For example, our Facebook page surpassed 10,000 followers over the past year (we had about 3.000 followers four years ago). In 2020, our YouTube channel had under 500 subscribers. Today, it has more than 3,000. This shows that the content our curia team is producing is engaging, inspirational, and educational, and people want to consume it because it is helping them.

For example, a search on You Tube for "How to go to Confession," has a video from our diocese in the top five for answering that question. Dive Deep, the official podcast of the Diocese of Springfield in Illinois, has listeners all over the world, and recently interviewed Father Mike Schmitz that attracted nearly 70,000 views. In July this year, an original documentary, created and produced by our curia team, will premiere. God is Alive tells five stories of miraculous events/ incredible faith stories in five different cities in Central Illinois that will boost people's spiritual lives.

With your generosity, we can continue creating engaging content and bring people closer to our faith or even back to our faith.
