Twenty-seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time, October 8, 2023

Dear Parishioners

This weekend we celebrate the 27th Sunday in Ordinary Time. Our readings this weekend confront the Jewish leaders with a parable concerning a vineyard. In this vineyard, the owner leases his property out to tenants. When the time came for the owner to receive his share of the produce, the tenants refuse the request, beating and/or killing the servants, and stoning another. Finally, the owner sends his son, hoping that they would respect him. Instead they "seized him, threw him out of the vineyard, and killed him." Then Jesus asks the question, "what will the owner do to those tenants when he comes?" Of course, they all answer that he will punish and kill them and lease his vineyard out to others who will give him the produce at the proper time. Without realizing it, they were condemning themselves for the tenants were really the Jewish leaders. But I think we can use this parable to help us understand our roles in this world. First, we are only tenants of what God has created. That means that we are not the owners. Second, we are to use what God has created and through our time and talents, produce good fruit from our lives. And then thirdly, God expects His share of what He has given to us. That means we are to use our time, talents, and treasures, all gifts from God, to somehow produce a rich yield for this God who is the landowner and creator of all that He has given to us. May each of us produce from our time, talents, and treasures, a rich harvest for our world and our Church.

This past week, I received the permission by the bishop to proceed with out capital campaign. He writes: "I am writing in response to the letter requesting permission to hire the Steier Group from Omaha, to begin the capital campaign for funding the capital improvements of the school campus of St. Peter Parish in Quincy, which would include a new cafeteria to be connected to the school, additional classrooms, and renovation of the old cafeteria. I understand that you are also requesting permission to hire an architect to provide conceptual drawings and cost estimates of these capital improvements." Thus we are able to officially begin putting shoes on this dream that we have to have a parish center as well as a cafeteria attached to the school with classrooms attached. May God help us in this endeavor.

This next week, Fr. Zach will be gone as he is going with our current 8th grade class in their annual trip to Washington, D.C. Please keep them in your prayers as they leave this Sunday on a long bus trip to our nation's capital and then return next Friday, October 13th in the evening.

Also, next Saturday, October 14th, the students of Quincy Notre Dame will be present at our 5:00 Mass to celebrate their homecoming weekend together. This is always a great tradition to see them present and so we welcome them and their parents to this annual celebration. May God keep them safe from all harm and grant them the wisdom to make the right choices.

FYI: With sadness I announce the death of Msgr. David Lantz. Msgr. Lantz was assigned here as the parochial vicar of St. Peter's from 1978-1982 as well as serving as a priest/teacher at QND during those same years. Please remember him in your prayers. "Eternal rest grant unto him O Lord."

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

On October 22, as we observe World Mission Sunday, we stand in solidarity with the Missions of the Church in this annual worldwide Eucharistic celebration.

Pope Francis reflected on this year's theme: "Hearts on fire, feet on the move?' The Holy Father invites us to kindle the fire of Christ's love in our hearts and to actively share this warmth with the world around us. Inspired by the Holy Spirit, we go forth and bring the Good News to all corners of the world.

Founded by French laywoman Blessed Pauline Jaricot in 1822, the Society for the Propagation of the Faith is an essential source of aid for the Church' missionary work In the United States, we benefited from these donations: up until 1908, we received close to 7 million dollars, the equivalent of over 250 million today. Those dioceses in our country, considered mission territories, continued to receive subsidies. Fairbanks, Alaska, was the last of those dioceses and received its final subsidy payment this year!

The World Mission Sunday collection assists the Holy Father to meet his Petrine obligation to build up the Church in over 1,100 dioceses and territories that are too young and/ or too poor to sustain themselves. Offerings support the formation of seminarians and religious men and women, assist in the construction of schools and orphanages, and enables missionaries to build churches in remote and resource-limited areas, and to meet essential works to proclaim the Gospel and celebrate the Sacraments.

Embodying this year's theme. I urge you to keep your hearts aflame and your feet moving this World Mission Sunday. Your prayers are invaluable, and your financial support provides life-giving aid to our brothers and sisters in the world's most vulnerable communities.
