Dear Parishioners,

According to our ordo, which is the official guide for our liturgical celebrations, it states the following about Advent: "Advent has a two-fold character, for it is a time for preparation for the Solemnities of Christmas in which the First Coming of the Son of God is remembered, and likewise is a time when, by remembrance of this, minds and hearts are led to look forward to Christ's Second Coming at the end of time. For these two reasons, Advent is a period of devout and expectant delight."

The official color for the season of Advent is violet. Advent also begins a new liturgical cycle of readings based on a three year cycle. This year our cycle of readings will be taken from Year B with St. Mark being the dominant gospel writer. The weekday readings which are based on a two year cycle will be from Year II. This is for your knowledge and information.

There are many differing customs which celebrate Advent. One of those customs I am most familiar with is the Advent Calendar. In my family, this calendar started on the first day of December, and participants in this custom would open a door, which each day holding a surprise be it a picture, or a Scripture passage, or some surprise. This opening would continue until Christmas day when we would open the final door with the Bethlehem scene. The whole idea of this custom was to help us understand "to wait," and "to anticipate." Another custom which we use, even in Church, is our Advent wreath. There are four candles, three purple and one rose, with each candle representing a Sunday of Advent. If used in the home, the following prayer of Blessing is encouraged:

Lord our God, we praise you for your Son, Jesus Christ; He is Emmanuel, the hope of the peoples, He is the wisdom that teaches and guides us, He is the Savior of every nation.

Lord God, let your blessing come upon us as we light the candles of this wreath. May the wreath and its light be a sign of Christ's promise to bring us salvation. May He come quickly and not delay. Amen.

This Friday, December 8th, is the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception, a Holyday of Obligation in our Church. This solemnity of Mary, under the title of the Immaculate Conception is important to our country and our diocese as we are under her watchful protection as our patron. The Immaculate Conception is the special privilege given to Mary whereby she was conceived in her mother's womb without original sin. This was supposed to be our privilege too if sin had not entered into the world and our lives. Our Mass will be as follows:

December 7th, Vigil of the Immaculate Conception: 6:00 p.m.

December 8th, the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception: Masses will be at 8:30 a.m., 10:00 a.m. at QND, 12:10 p.m., and 6:00 p.m.

The Feast of St. Nicholas (270-343) is Wednesday, December 6th. His legendary habit of gift-giving gave rise to the traditional model of Santa Claus.
