Dear Parishioners,

"Alleluia. This is the day the Lord has made; let us rejoice and be glad." This is the proclamation of our Responsorial Psalm for this Easter Sunday. Yes, this is the day the Lord has made; let us rejoice and be glad. On behalf of our parish and school staff, our deacons, as well as Fr. Zach Samples and myself, I want to wish each and everyone of you a Blessed and Happy Easter. After six weeks of Lent, sacrifices and penances, our hearts and our lives are renewed in the joy of Easter.

In our gospel for this day, we hear the following: "On the first day of the week, Mary of Magdala came to the tomb early in the morning, while it was still dark, and saw the stone removed from the tomb. Running to Peter and the other disciple whom Jesus loved, she said, 'they have taken the Lord from the tomb, and we don't know where they put him.' So Peter and the other disciple went out and came to the tomb. When they arrived, Peter went into the tomb and saw the burial cloths there, and the cloth that had covered his head, not with the burial cloths but rolled up in a separate place. Then the other disciple also went in and he saw and believed." Between the empty tomb and the burial cloths situated the way they were, was all the proof that these two disciples needed to see and believe. They might not have fully understood what rising from the dead meant, but the proofs that were present were all that they needed to elicit from them their faith and hope that Jesus had risen from the dead. In time, they would experience His risen presence as He appeared to them over a span of about 40 days. My hope and prayer for all of us is that we too will see with the eyes of faith and truly believe that what Jesus promised in His resurrection would be fulfilled for all of us.

Next Saturday, April 6th, our third graders from our parish will be going over to the Cathedral in Springfield to celebrate with the Bishop their First Holy Communion and Confirmation. I want to congratulate these young people from our parish and pray that they remain ever faithful to these sacraments that they will be receiving. I also want to thank their parents and teachers for providing the proper formation that they needed to complete their sacraments of Initiation. As a parish family we will celebrate their second (first) communion here at St. Peter next Sunday, April 7th, at the 11:00 a.m. Mass. Please join us for this special gathering.

I also want to thank all those who helped decorate the Church for our Easter celebrations. A special thank you to Frericks Gardens for providing the flowers which enhanced the beauty of the Church. I also thank our cantors, choirs, musicians, servers, ushers and greeters for helping to make our liturgies a wonderful experience for those present. And a special thank you to our parishioners who were present to celebrate the joy of Easter. May this mystery of Easter fill our lives with hope that Jesus has conquered sin and death and given us a share in His new life.

They ate a portion and they took a portion to those who stayed home. They love to share."
