Third Sunday of Easter, April 14, 2024

Dear Parishioners.

We continue to celebrate the season of Easter, only this weekend we celebrate the 3rd Sunday. On this third Sunday, the scene for our gospel is immediately after Jesus' appearance to the disciples on the road to Emmaus. These disciples had returned to Jerusalem to tell the apostles that Jesus had risen. They were filled with excitement as they recognized Jesus in the breaking of the bread. So the disciples were gathered together and the risen Christ appears once again to them. One would have expected that Jesus might have been critical of the apostles for abandoning Him, or perhaps questioning their behavior through His suffering and death. Instead, the very first words out of His mouth were the words, "Peace be with you." Jesus desired that His friends would find peace in His presence. And in spite of their confusion and disbelief, He asks them "why they are troubled?" Continuing He asks them "why do questions arise in your hearts?" As a Savior and friend, He invites them to look at His hands and His feet, reassuring them that He had risen. He even invites them to come forward and to touch Him, proving that He had risen and they were not seeing a ghost. And to strengthen them further, He even eats with them, showing them that what they were seeing was the actual Risen Jesus. What does it take for us to believe in that Risen Christ? Jesus has died, has risen, and continues to dwell in our world through His Word and His Sacraments. And just as He reminded His apostles that they were to be witnesses for this Easter mystery, so He reminds all of us that we have the same role. We are called, like the apostles, to realize how much we are loved, how much we are forgiven, and then to model this love and forgiveness to others. Let's hear Jesus saying to each of us this weekend, "Peace be with you."

This Friday night, April 12, Bishop Paprocki will be ordaining 5 men of the diocese to the order of the diaconate. Four of them will be ordained to the transitional deacon which means that within another year they will be ordained priests. The fifth man will be ordained to the permanent diaconate. I ask your prayer for these men who have responded to God's call to serve the Church whether as priests and/or deacons. I also encourage our parish to pray for more vocations to both the priesthood and consecrated life. Without priests, we have no Eucharist. I also encourage our parents to encourage their children to be open to whatever God is calling them to whatever calling in life. When our young people respond to God's call, they will always find His peace and a sense of fulfillment. I know that personally after serving as a priest for 49 years in May.

I ask your continual support of our **Upon this Rock** campaign. We have been very blessed by parishioners who have responded so generously as stewards to financially support this campaign as well as through your prayer for its success. All I have to do is to look at our current pledge totals and I have to admit that this parish family continues to amaze me in its generosity. What our success reflects is our sense of stewardship as we have experienced God's blessings and gifts to us in so many ways, and in return, desire to return to Him a generous portion of what we have received. To those who have filled out your pledge cards, I thank you. For those who are still contemplating, I also thank you for considering your support for this once in a lifetime campaign to enhance our campus.

The Franciscan Friars' Dinner


