Dear Parishioners.

This weekend the Catholic Churches of Illinois along with many other dioceses throughout the United States celebrate the Solemnity of the Ascension of Our Lord into heaven. When I was growing up, a long time ago, we celebrated the Ascension as Ascension Thursday, 40 days after Easter. The reason for the 40 days is found in our first reading from the Acts of the Apostles. In that reading, we hear the following: "He presented Himself alive to them by many proofs after He had suffered, appearing to them during forty days and speaking about the kingdom of God." Then this particular reading continues: "When He had said this, as they were looking on, He was lifted up, and a cloud took Him from their sight." It is with that understanding that the Church for many years celebrated the Ascension, 40 days after Easter. It was also one of the six holydays of obligation. But unfortunately, because of the busyness of people, they would not remember this Holyday. And so people didn't attend Mass as expected. In the spirit of making this Feast the Solemnity that it is, many of the Churches in the United States moved this Solemnity to the final Sunday of Easter, thus replacing the 7th Sunday of Easter with now the Ascension of Jesus into heaven. I think that this was a very fitting move in order to have a greater participation in this Solemnity that completes the Paschal Mystery.

As many of you might read in our diocesan newspaper, the Catholic Times, I have concluded my appointment as Dean of the Quincy Deanery while retaining my duties as pastor of St. Peter Church and Chaplain at Quincy Notre Dame High School. I also, according to Canon Law, submitted my letter of resignation as pastor of St. Peter Church. Whether a pastor or even a Bishop, when one turns 75 years of age, one is expected to submit their letter of resignation. For a bishop, it means a letter to the Pope; for a pastor, it means a letter to the Bishop. And so I fulfilled the particular law with the expectation that it will be a year to year discussion with the Bishop.

FYI: St. Peter School will celebrate their graduation/promotion of our 8th grade students on Tuesday, May 14th, at 6:00 p.m. in the Church. As we honor these young people at a graduation Mass, our prayers are with them as they begin their high school years. We only hope and pray that what we have taught, and how they were formed, will live out through their years of learning that await them. We congratulate them and pray for them.

Also, we will be closing our PSR program with a Mass this Wednesday, May 15th, at 6:30 p.m. Even though we conclude their classes, I reassure them that there is no vacation from their living out their faith, especially celebrating the Eucharist each weekend.

Finally, our last day of school here at St. Peter School will be on Friday, May 24th, Since the Eucharist is the center of our lives as Catholics, we will have a Mass at 8:30 on that Friday followed by a school picnic.

As a reminder, don't forget about the ordination to the priesthood of Deacon Jayke White on Saturday, May 25th, at 10:00 in the Cathedral in Springfield. There will be No Mass nor confessions on that Saturday.


St. Dominic Junefest
